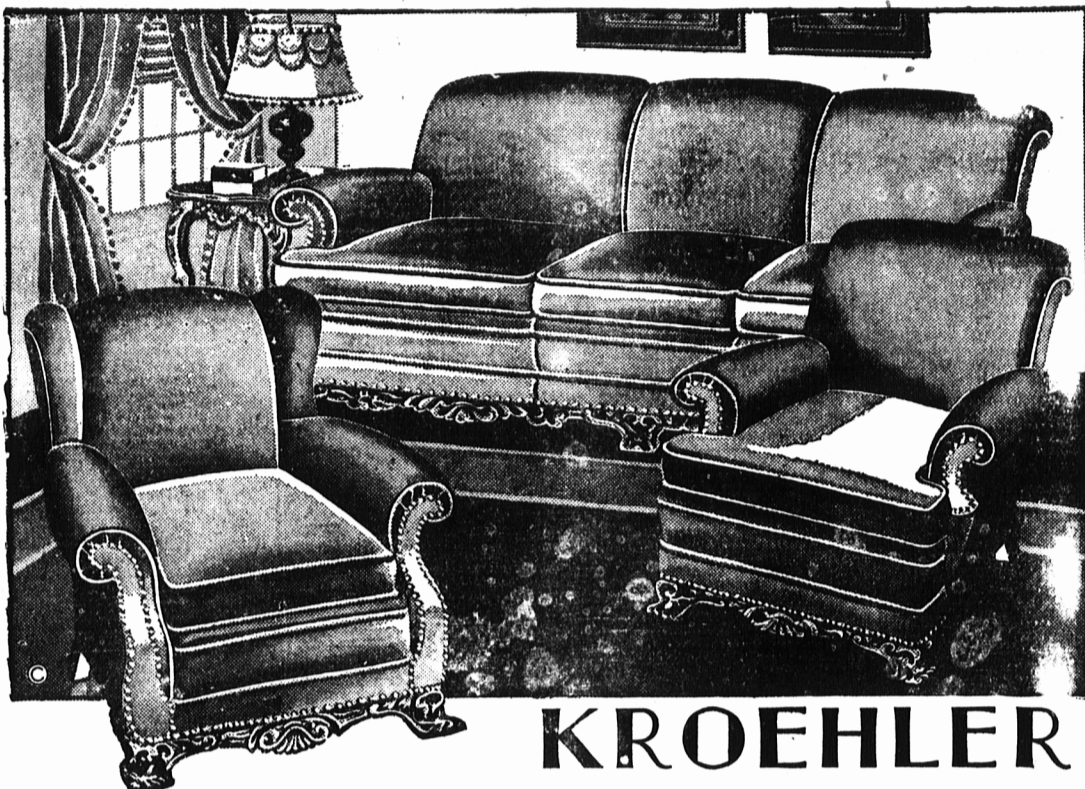

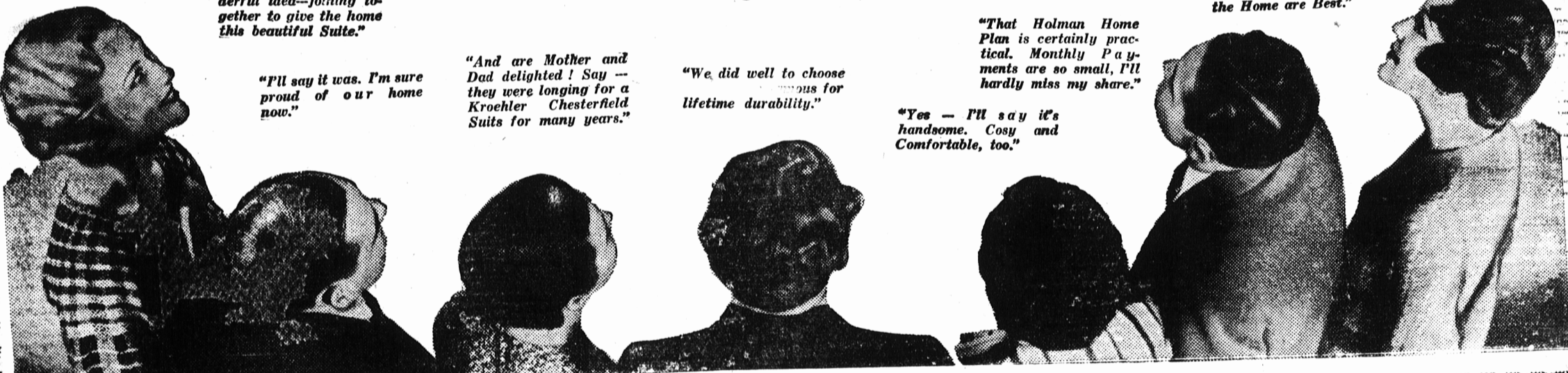

NO NEED OF FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION

Enforcement of Existing Laws Would End Business Malpractices Claims W. McL Clarke.

P. by Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, Dec. 11.—A plea for enforcement of existing laws and regulations rather than new measures to eradicate abuses and malpractices in Canadian business was made today by W. McL Clarke, Chairman of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, addressing the Canadian Shoe Manufacturers' Association here.

"I believe," he stated, "that we need to bring about in Canada the effectiveness of whatever protective social tariff we enjoy. By this phrase I do not mean the tariff of industry, but rather the tariffs as adopted by the Government of Canada, Federal and Provincial since Confederation, which when applied, regulate commerce and set up standards therefor.

B. C. Relief Officials Are Besieged

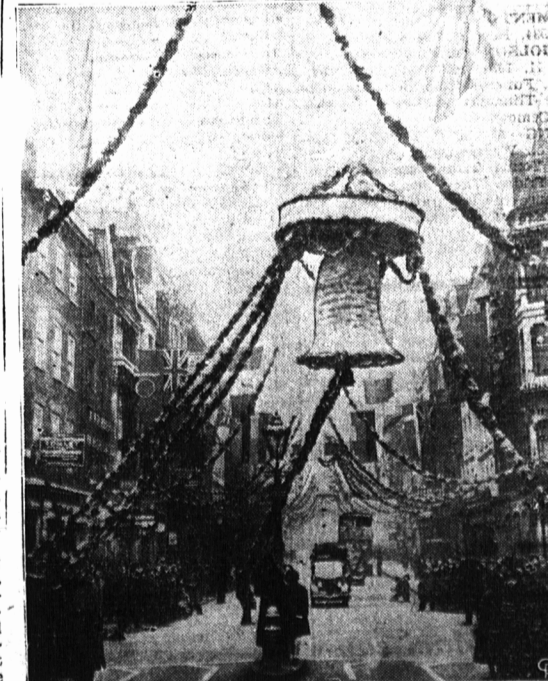
Dies At Wheel Of Automobile
