### Have to Worry Along on Two Per Cent. Beer

TORONTO, March 16.—Citizens of the Province of Ontario will have to worry along on two per cent beer. Attorney General W. G. Roney informed Secretary W. T. Kernahan, of the Ontario Brewers' Association on this effect today when the minister replied to a request recently made by the brew...

The brewers association, in making the application assured the Government that "the cause of temperance would best be served and the working man of the province would be better satisfied, if a beverage containing 2.5 per cent of alcohol by weight were permitted to be manufactured and sold anywhere in the province by any one without a license."

The Attorney-General, replying, stated that in his opinion the answer to this request was given by the polls on the referendum vote last October. He cites the big "no" majority given on the beer question in substantiation of his opinion.

SHIPPING TIED UP BY LONGSHORE MEN'S STRIKE AT N. Y.  
Coastwise shipping firms in New York cancelled all passenger bookings and placed an embargo on freight to southern ports because of the longshoremen's strike.

NORFOLK RANGE HAD A NARROW ESCAPE  
The Furness-Withy liner Norfolk Range had a narrow escape from being ashore while anchored outside of Portland harbor last week.

FOUR LOST ON SHIP ISIAH K. STETSON  
The coast guard cutter Aushnet rescued two men from the three-masted schooner Isiah K. Stetson, bound from New York for Annapolis (N. S.) with coal.

TWO BARGES SINK WITH LOSS OF LIFE  
Captain James Macweeney, of Charlottetown, Mass., was drowned and four or five other men were probably lost when two barges No. 7 and No. 19, laden with coal from Norfolk for Boston, and owned by the Consolidated Coal company, of Boston, broke clear of a three-barge tow and sank six miles northwest of Black Island, R. I., Tuesday morning.

LONDON, March 16.—Earl Curzon's speech on the Turkish problem, made in the House of Lords yesterday and other official or unofficial statements on the subject are generally regarded as showing that the Near East tangle is quite serious and is causing the authorities some anxiety—an anxiety increased by complications threatened in connection with Syria and Mesopotamia.

Dangerous to Press Turks.  
The suggestion that the employment of force against the Turks might excite general peril in the Mussulman world is regarded as one that cannot be safely ignored.

Careful Watch on Syria.  
Careful watch is being kept here on the outcome of the Syrian Congress at Damascus, and it is understood that any decision or proposal at the Peace Conference regarding Syria would be purely tentative.

Civil Service Bonus  
OTTAWA, March 16.—Three confronting assurances were given by Sir George Postor on the subject of the new bonus to a large deputation from the Civil Service Federation convention, which met the Acting Prime Minister.

TO FORCE HOOVER INTO CAMPAIGN.  
NEW YORK, March 16.—Herbert Hoover has definitely refused to align himself with any of the organized political parties as at present constituted, characterizing himself as an "independent progressive."
