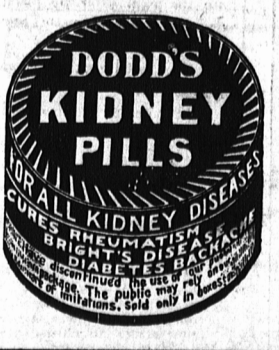

### MEND YOUR WAYS.

A worthy citizen entitled to fair credit for veracity, (barring sundry election yarns and reports of big fish caught) avers that he had counted the holes in the sidewalk in the district known as Sunnyside. He finds 126 holes of full size, besides numerous half holes perforations, cavities and dents. The six score and six first named holes this deponent declares to be of the more serious, back-wrenching, foot-twisting, ankle-spraining variety. Every one of these he claims in the interest of public safety and the proper security of the nether extremities and walking apparatus of a more or less amiable pedestrian public ought to be repaired, filled in, covered over, or, flagged by day, red-lanterned by night and conspicuously marked "dangerous". Of course, it would cost something for flags, lanterns, oil and attendance but there would be compensation in the following ways: (1) increased public safety; 2) lessened accident insurance; (3) better light at night—two street lamps might be dispensed with saving \$140 yearly; (4) enhanced reputation of the City Fathers for deliberation and public care.

As to the 900 half-holes, perforations, cavities and apertures in the Sunnyside sidewalk, less dangerous to the mass of our people than the 126 holes above enumerated, our informant points out that these are not all of the non-dangerous class, either in a physical or moral sense. For a hole that might not be large enough to entrap the number 10 or 11 both of a Mayor or City Councillor might peradventure swallow up a dainty feminine number two of some Woman's Councillor, which also by reason of concealing skirts cannot so readily avoid the dangers of the way. Then there are the moral dangers, and perils to prestige and dignity which run parallel with the physical dangers. Tripping the light fantastic toe may be conducive to geniality, but tripping on a broken sidewalk harrows up the sole and has been known to provoke even a deacon to use language unbecoming to a professor. And it stands—or rather it falls—to reason that when a dignified citizen or citizeness suddenly goes prostrate there may arise, as in the days of Ahasuerus "much contempt and wrath." Especially is this the case when mistaken onlookers seize the occasion to remark "that they could wish there was not a drop of whiskey in Charlottetown." Thus a sidewalk that is more hole than righteous may swallow up a more or less virtuous reputation.

In like manner a whole city may lose its reputation by the too numerous holes in its sidewalks. We are inviting the home-comers, and yet how can they fall upon our necks if they have first broken their own? They are bone of our bone and flesh of our flesh. Is that a fair reason to invite them to come where they must needs lacerate their flesh and break their bones? Sunnyside is not our worst sidewalk. There are shady sides, east sides and west sides that are as bad or worse. Of course something can be said for the existing order of things. There can always be something said. A hole will wear longer than a patch, and many a man in falling has made progress by falling his length ahead. We trust our City Fathers will not listen to such shallow sophistries. We appeal to His Worship. Who would want to be Mayor of a one-horse town? We expostulate with the Councillors and admonish them to mend their ways and put some sound new planks in their platforms. If they will not do this let them, at once provide five thousand danger signals, and a like number of red lanterns to warn unwary pedestrians of the traps that beset their feet.
