QUEEN MAUD VERY FOND OF SKI-ING.

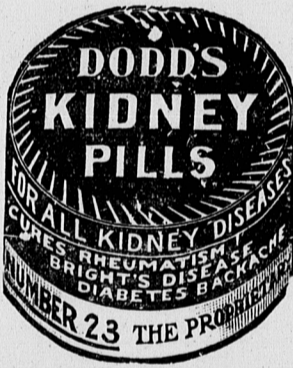

ANOTHER "DANIEL BLAKE RUSSELL" AFTER BIG ESTATE.

FRESNO, Cal., March 20—Another claimant of the \$75,000 estate left by Daniel Russell, of Melrose (Mass.), appeared today, when I. Johnson made affidavit before a notary that his real name was Daniel Blake Russell, son of the capitalist. Johnson said he was not aware that "his father" was wealthy until he read of the search for heirs.

He declared that all his knowledge of the town of Melrose came from his early life. He described the house in which he formerly lives as "situated on a knoll and facing Trenton street."

Johnson is the second California claimant to the Russell name and estate. A few days ago the Melrose police received a letter from San Francisco, written in behalf of an alleged Daniel Blake Russell, which protested that while he did not care for the money, he did not wish to see any impostor get it. The Sun Francisco police have not found the writer nor have the police of several other cities, who have been on the lookout for the real Daniel Blake Russell.

SUFFRAGETTE ADDRESSES.

TORONTO, Ont., March 21.—Miss Oliva Smith, of London, England, created a scene at the Legislature on Saturday by leaning from the Speakers gallery before the Lieut. Governor had finished his speech, and demanding votes for women.

She spoke in a well modulated voice, and her words were distinctly audible throughout the Chamber.

KING EDWARD SAID TO BE UNWELL.

LONDON, March 20—There is increasing uneasiness in Court and Government circles today over the unfavorable news from Biarritz regarding the health of King Edward. Early despatches said that the King was suffering only from a cold, but it develops that he has also had several severe chills since going to the French resort. His illness would probably be considered trifling in a younger man, but owing to the King's age his indispositions always create alarm.
