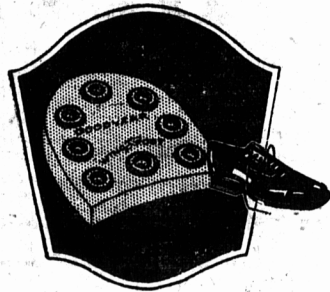

To make a frozen dessert, try freezing canned fruit in the can. Pack it in finely chopped ice and salt, three parts ice to one part salt. Cover the can completely and let it stand for three or four hours; remove from the ice; wipe dry and open carefully. Wrap a cloth wrung out of hot water around the can to loosen the frozen fruit. Serve it with whipped cream. Grape fruit, pears, pineapple, apricots peaches, almost any fruit is delicious this way.
