THE NEW DALTON SANATORIUM.—Recent visitors to the Dalton Sanatorium were greatly impressed with the magnitude and beauty of the reconstructed and enlarged building and quite ready to realize that when completed it will be one of the finest convalescent homes in Canada. Two new wings have been added to the original Dalton building making the whole structure 550 feet in length and three storeys in height. Only a comparatively few of the wards and rooms have been completed but those now receiving the finishing touches give a good idea of the elegance and beauty of the home when completed. Any attempt at description at this stage would be useless as only a general conception of the whole plant can be gathered in its present form. The amount of work already done and yet to be done, the immense quantity of lumber used and the difficulty of transportation involved, for there are hills in the neighborhood, give an idea not only of the size of the contract undertaken by the Messrs H. and S. Lowe but of the immense preparation being made by the Government throughout Canada for the care of the soldiers. The new Dalton Sanatorium will be one of Prince Edward Island's greatest landmarks and beauty spots for many years to come not only because of the magnificence of the building but of the scenic beauty of the location.

QUEBEC EXTENDS SYMPATHY TO TORONTO

QUEBEC, August 9.—The Quebec Telegraph, in an editorial headed "Toronto Cutting Loose," comments as follows on the rioting there:

"The tenacity with which the Toronto rioters persist in their work of devastation and disorder makes the little disturbances of last spring in Quebec pale into insignificance. Between seventy-five and eighty thousand dollars worth of damage, including money fished from the safes of the battered restaurants, is the estimated damage which has been done beside which the damage to property in the Quebec riot is relatively insignificant. We extend our sympathies to Toronto in its reign of lawlessness and terror, and we assure all peaceful citizens, who wish to escape from its anarchy, that the ancient city of Quebec is a comparatively tranquil haven, which will hospitably welcome

the refugees from mob rule in Toronto.

"Imitation may be the sincerest form of flattery, but no such demonstration was necessary to emphasize the sentiments which Toronto no doubt entertains towards Quebec. And when the imitation so far exceeds the original, as in the present case, we are inclined to think that Toronto is animated by a certain jealous pride into showing us that here in Quebec

we do not know how to stage a really first class riot and that there, as elsewhere, Toronto takes the lead. It is an ambitious city, Toronto. Hamilton has no copyright monopoly to that name."
