PAARDEBERG DAY.

Three years ago yesterday some thirty of the sons of Prince Edward Island participated in the memorable conflict which marked the turn of the tide in the South African war.

But Paardeberg Day is worthy of perpetual memorial because it marked the turning point in a most memorable struggle. It was here that Cronje, the "Lion of the veldt" was brought to bay, surrounded, and compelled to surrender with his thousands of fighting men and implements of war.

We hope to be able to publish on Monday morning the result of the closely contested general election in New Brunswick which takes place today.

At the recent meeting of the Provincial Executive it was decided to summon the Legislature to meet on Thursday March 19. The meeting will be an important one in several respects, and although called later than we could desire will still be earlier than in a number of years past.

graduates of the six classes named could send all their sons to Harvard College within the six years—1902-07 inclusive—they would only supply 100 freshmen a year, or possibly one-seventh of the number who will enter.

"It is probable that the regrettable result indicated in the above table is due in part to the late postponement of marriage on the part of educated young men, a postponement which the protracted education now prescribed for men who enter the learned and scientific professions makes almost unavoidable.

Among the departmental reports which form a part of President Eliot's report is included this year for the first time a report on athletic sports by Professor Ira N. Hollis. Some significance may be attached to the position of this report in the order of departmental reports, for it follows those on Harvard College and the Lawrence Scientific School and precedes the reports on the graduate school and the professional schools, thus inviting the inference that athletic sports are after all the concern chiefly of the two undergraduate departments.

President Eliot calls attention to the interesting fact that at least 2,000 of the 3,500 students in the Cambridge departments of the university take part in some outdoor sport. He notes that changes in football rules have been followed by an increase in injuries and says that "under the existing rules the game tends to become slower and less visible in its details and therefore less interesting."

"Moreover, the ethics of the game, which are the imperfect ethics of war, do not improve. The martial axiom—attack the enemy's weakest point—inevitably leads to the deliberate onslaught on the cripple or the convalescent in the opposing line; and the habitual violation of rules, if penalties be escaped, is regarded by many as merely amusing."

Of athletic sports in general President Eliot says that there is increasing objection to their great exaggeration. "There is now a series of competitive games which covers the entire academic year; and the distraction of large bodies of students from the proper work of the university grows more intense and continues year after year. This unreasonable exaggeration of sport and exercise has become a serious drawback also in secondary schools. The range of elective selection among the studies of the college is seriously limited because of the desire of students, and therefore of teachers, to avoid appointments in the afternoons. Such are some of the evils which attend the prevailing exaggeration of athletic sports; but whenever the evils consequent upon this exaggeration are mentioned, it should also be mentioned that the outdoor sports on the average and in the mass do more good than harm; for they promote vigorous physical development and provide invaluable safeguards against effeminacy and vice."

The report shows that in the university as a whole the expenditure for salaries for instruction was 45 per cent of the total expenditure for the year; the expenditure for aids was 8 per cent, for the university library 5 per cent, for museums 5 per cent, for running expenses of public buildings 7 per cent, for the observatory and apparatus 6 per cent and for all other purposes 24 per cent.
