SHORT REVIEW BY "BIG JIM"

Nature smiled with beautiful weather for each of the three big mid-summer racing events viz: St. Peters, New Annan and Montague and each were favored with record attendances. There was great racing at each meeting. The change to the

"three heat plan," seems to have infused new life and vigor into light harness racing in this province. The classification of horses by the amount of "money won," with "every heat a race," does away with "holding" and "laying up" of heats. The advent of many Mainland race horses both at New Annan and Montague created a great uncertainty as to the outcome of all racing events. This is the same of enjoyment for the fans. If they could "fridge" it all out before the first heat of a race, interest in the heats would die a sudden death. Our people like to see our brother Maritimers, and Americans race their horses on the "red clay" and we are of the opinion the feeling reacts psychologically on our visitors. Tom Holmes and Monte Gerow both successful trainers and drivers always receive the glad hand of welcome from our native sportsmen. Mr Gerow has avowed his intention of making his domicile on P. E. Island. Dr. McAllister and other Mainlanders will be welcomed at the big Exhibition races—they get a genuine Little wonder they like to come to our Exhibition races—they get a genuine welcome and a square deal—wherefore the increased magnitude and fame of our Provincial Fair and races on the Mainland. The "personal" touch puts it over. Sentiment is not dead. All is not materialistic. The Mainland entries had tough luck at New Annan. Three Island horses won three first places. At Montague the tables were turned and three Mainland entries won firsts. It remains to be seen how they will compare at the Charlottetown races.
