AUSSIE JAY-WALKERS CAUSE OF ACCIDENTS

SYDNEY, Australia, May 29 — (CP) — State authorities in New South Wales are considering a campaign to improve the behavior of pedestrians who are blamed for 1,425 traffic accidents last year. Twenty were killed and 23 injured crossing roads casually; 12 were killed and 161 injured running across roads; 13 were killed and 191 injured because of carelessness due to over-drinking; six were killed and 66 injured by walking with their backs to oncoming traffic; 10 were killed and 70 injured because of hesitation in front of approaching cars.

Egg production in Prince Edward Island declined slightly during the past week with a drop in receipts of approximately five per cent. It was announced yesterday by Mr. F. M. Nash, senior poultry products inspector who returned to his old job after leave of absence while serving with the Canadian Army.

The demand is fair to good. The quality was said to be slightly lower due to yolk condition. 1975 cases were inspected for their paying prices, especially for the higher grades. The first class stations are quoting for ungraded eggs delivered: A Large, 20-22; B Large, 18-20; C Large, 16-18; D Large, 14-16; E Large, 12-14; F Large, 10-12; G Large, 8-10; H Large, 6-8; I Large, 4-6; J Large, 2-4.

ARMIES HOLD POLISH LAND

WARSAW, May 29 — (CP) — Although Red Army troops have turned back to the Poles several million acres of land once farmed to provide foodstuffs for the Russians, they still hold big slices of Poland territory.

The Socialist party newspaper Robotnik said the Red Army, in Lower Silesia alone, occupies 350,000 acres of farmland, including 745 estates once owned by Polish aristocrats. In Lower Silesia, the Polish Army farms 125 estates, approximately 40,000 acres. Another 220 estates, some 20,000 acres, are in the hands of various beneficiaries.

"Reparations and settlers who go into Lower Silesia are for the moment up in the air," the newspaper said. "It is either the owners or the managers of the land, and their work naturally suffers as a result of this. This is a matter for the administration of the western territories, members of which often are chosen because of their party adherence rather than for their competence."

Robotnik demanded a more rapid parceling of big estates in Lower Silesia to enable more Polish settlers to make their homes in the former German territory.
