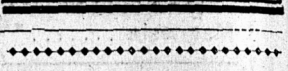

JAPAN INVITED

(Canadian Press) TOKYO, Oct. 8.—The British invitation to Japan to participate in a five power naval conference was published here tonight after its receipt by the Foreign Office. The invitations say that it was considered desirable that the conference should be summoned for the third week in January to consider categories of vessels not covered in the Washington treaty, and to deal with the questions covered

in paragraph two, article 21, of that treaty. The invitation which is approximately a thousand words in length, reviews the Anglo-American conversations in which it was stated agreement had been reached on the following:

- 1-The Kellogg Pact is the starting point of the agreement. 2-Anglo-American parity of all naval categories shall be reached by the end of 1936. 3-The desirability to reconsider the battleship replacement programmes of the Washington treaty of

1922, with a view to diminish the amount of replacement construction therein implied. 4—Total abolition of Submarines subject to conference with other naval powers.

SEA-SICK CREW STOP SHIP

GLASGOW, Oct. 8.—(British United Press)—A Glasgow steamer has been forced to put in at Holyhead because her Lascar crew was suffering too badly from sea-sickness to work. This comedy of the sea occurred on board the Goschen, which

sailed from Clyde the other day for Bombay under the command of Captain MacDonald. All went well until the vessel met a gale and heavy seas. The effect on the native crew was soon evident, and one after another they retired to their bunks. The British officers were the only men not affected, so the ship was forced to put in at Holyhead. The crew immediately resigned.

Maritimers In The West

Supreme Court Justice Walter H. Trueman made the province of Manitoba his home nearly 20 years ago. He won his way to the bench, as did A. A. Dymart, of Kent county, who located there about the same time. Judge Dymart is a brother of Hon. Allison Dymart, at present leading the New Brunswick Opposition in the Legislature.

There are examples of Maritimers serving the west even earlier. We have all heard of Buleya when governor of the territories. Then there was Dr. Levertt George DeVeber, who was born in Saint John 83 years ago and after gaining his medical diploma in this and the Old Country finally made his way to the west and was elected by acclamation to the Northwest in 1893 before the prairie province, entered Confederation. When seven years later Alberta joined the Union the former Saint John man was made a minister and soon after a senator. Before this William Dell Perley, a native of Sunbury, after a stormy and unsuccessful political career in New Brunswick, located in Saskatchewan, found favor with the electors there and was a member of the Northwest Council. Later when there was a chance to go to Ottawa in 1887 he was chosen a member and the next year was summoned to the Senate. Another politician from York, E. L. Wetmore, who was an Opposition leader in the New Brunswick Legislature, went to the prairie provinces and became a Supreme Court judge. An example of modern days is that of Harry Lunney, a former Saint John boy, now judge of the Supreme Court of Alberta.

It is but natural for eastern Canadians to be just as successful in the west as their fathers were upon the Atlantic coast. Nothing can do more for Canadian solidarity than the interchange of people from the provinces forming the Dominion. The public men of the west can have a truer conception of the aims and ambitions of the east when some of them can visualize the places of their nativity. In spite of present surroundings, the claims of personal interest, their duty to their constituents and all the ties that now bind them they are never quite willing or able to forget the lyric of John Howard Payne, "Home Sweet Home."
