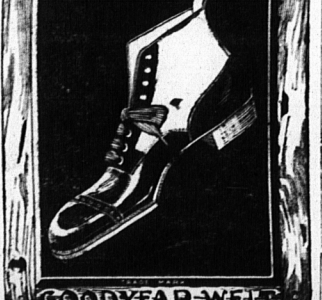
The properties at Montague, Murray River and Sydney can be tendered for separately or jointly but will be sold subject to Mrs. Cameron's dower interest.

KING EDWARD AND GERMAN KAISER

The Results of Their Meeting at Wilhelmshohe - French Regard Meeting as Marking Another Stage in the Relaxation of European Tension.

CASSEL, Prussia, August 15.—King Edward left Wilhelmshohe shortly before midnight. His visit with Emperor William was short of duration, but nevertheless it is regarded as most important, and it is said in well informed political circles that, in the course of the conversation between the two monarchs, the political situation was discussed in the most friendly terms. Prince Von Buelow and Sir Charles Harding also had a long and earnest conversation, and it is the general opinion that the results of the visits will be far reaching and place the relations of Great Britain and Germany upon a better footing.

Frederick and Queen Victoria, and concluded with saying he considered that King Edward represented the English nation, and that his visit was an expression of the desire for a good understanding between the two nations. King Edward replied that his dearest wish was to see good relations between the German and the English peoples and he assured the emperor that on the occasion of his coming visit to England he would receive a most hearty and popular welcome.

IMMIGRANTS ARE BETTER

OTTAWA, Aug. 15.—Dr. Bryce, Chief Medical Inspector of the Immigration Department, states that the physical condition of immigrants now arriving in Canada is far better than ever before. This is due to the rigid Immigration Act, passed a few years ago, and to the thorough manner in which it is being enforced. The steamship companies knowing that they will have to bear the cost of deporting or of treating diseased immigrants, are exercising the greatest care at English and Continental ports, and are refusing to carry any person likely to be rejected on arrival in Canada by the Dominion officials.

The Foot of the Reindeer. The foot of the reindeer is most peculiar in construction. It is cloven through the middle, and each half curves upward in front. It is slightly elongated and capable of a considerable amount of expansion. When placed on an irregular surface, which is difficult to traverse, the animal contracts the feet into a sort of claw, by which a firm hold is secured. When moving rapidly, the two portions of the foot as it is lifting strike together, the hoofs making a continuous clattering noise, which may be heard at a considerable distance. It is this peculiarity of the feet that makes the reindeer so sure footed and so valuable in rocky and uneven country, where almost any other animal would prove a failure as a beast of burden.
