Death of Tennyson.

The voice of the sweet singer of England is hushed in death. On Thursday morning Lord Tennyson, the poet laureate, passed away at the age of 83 years, his end being described by his physician as the most glorious he had ever witnessed.

Death of Sir George Macleod.

Recent English papers contain notices of the death of Sir George Macleod of Glasgow. His father, uncle and brother were well-known to the generation of Highlanders, who settled in this Island in the early part of this century.

The eminent surgeon was born in 1828 in Campsie, of which his father was the parish minister, and belonged to a family the members of which all attained distinction. His eldest brother, Norman, born in 1812, and therefore 16 years his senior, was the famous minister of the Barony, and died in 1872—exactly 20 years ago.

Sir George studied in the Glasgow University, taking his degree in 1853, and subsequently attended the medical schools of Paris and Berlin. When the Crimean war broke out he proceeded thither and acted as senior surgeon to the hospital at Sebastopol. Upon his return he published a book entitled "Surgery in the Crimea," which did much to establish his fame.
