PRISONERS OF WAR. WHAT ONE MINISTER DID.—The Rev. J. Heaney appealed to his congregations last Sunday for support for the "Prisoners of War Fund," with the result that the Cornwall Methodist Church adopted two prisoners, and the Methodist churches at North Wiltshire and Kingston, one each. This is a splendid example, which may well be followed by other congregations. \$4.58 supplies a prisoner with a weekly box of provisions. Canon Simpson, Charlottetown, is the Treasurer of the Fund for P. E. I., and will give any information required.

NEW ADOPTIONS OF PRISONERS OF WAR.—Seven more prisoners have been adopted this week. Two by the Cornwall Methodist Church, one each by Kingston and New Wiltshire Methodist Churches. Elmstead, Red Cross, Malpeque W. P. A. and Wm. Clark & Sons, N. Wiltshire, and a donation of \$100 from Miss T. A. Trobe, Orwell. That makes eighty-nine now provided for, and several other adoptions are certain, but the money has not yet been received by the Treasurer. Any Society wishing to be classed among the first hundred adoptions should make no delay, but notify Canon Simpson at once. \$4.50 a month covers all expenses.


