EGG LAYING CONTEST.
Notes on the P. E. I. Egg Laying Contest for the 45th Week Ending Aug. 11, 1923.

There was a further decrease noted in production of the Charlottetown Egg Laying Contest for the 45th week ending September 11, 1923. The production for the week being 712 compared with 735 of the previous week. A large number of the birds are broody, especially the Barred Rocks, and they are also heavy in moult. The total number of eggs laid to date is 28,435.

Mr. D. F. McDonald's pen of Barred Rocks leads the Contest for the week with 46 eggs. Mr. Wendal Raham's pen of Anconas second with 45 eggs, Mrs. Edward Bulpitt's pen of White Leghorns third with 44 eggs, Mr. L. B. Toombs' pen of Barred Rocks fourth with 43 eggs, The Experimental Station's pen of White Leghorns No. 13 fifth with 42 eggs, and the Experimental Station's pen of White Leghorns No. 18 sixth with 41 eggs.

Mrs. Edward Bulpitt's pen of White Leghorns leads the Contest to date with 1749 eggs. Mr. D. F.
