Several hundred tons of the steamer's cargo was unloaded. 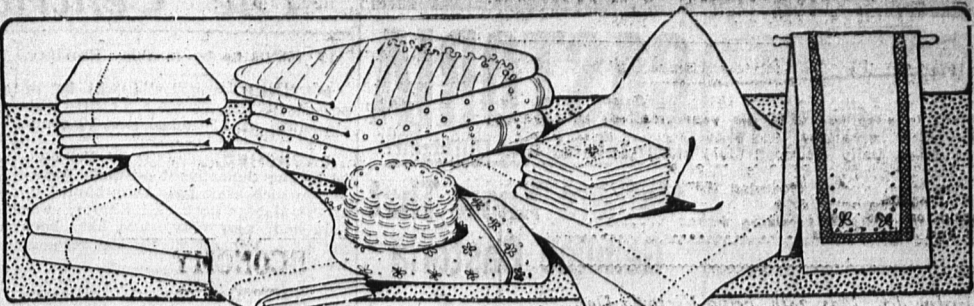
