Curious Bits of News.

Scotland for many years held the record for the highest mill chimney in the world, but now the Silver Works Company, at Antwerp, has beaten that record with a shaft 410 feet high, surmounted by a lightning conductor 50 feet high.

An examination of the ravages due to tuberculosis shows that England, with a damp and foggy climate, only loses 50,000 consumptives per annum, while in France, with a much healthier climate, the victims, on an equal population, are annually 150,000.

The flags to be hoisted at one time in signaling at sea never exceed four. It is an interesting arithmetical fact that with eighteen various colored flags, and never more than four at a time, no fewer than seventy-eight thousand six hundred and forty-two signals can be given.

In the recent heat wave in Rome four swimmers made up a party at eleven o'clock in the morning and proceeded to take their breakfast in the Tiber. They appeared on the river bank carrying a table loaded with dainties, pushed off, and had their meal without returning to the bank, and what is more surprising, without touching the bottom.

A singular deed has been filed in Northumberland County, Pa. It is dated October 9, 1793. In a series of whereas it traces the ownership of the land conveyed from the Creator of the earth, who, "by parole and livery of seisin did enfeoff the parents of mankind, to wit, Adam and Eve, of all that certain tract of land called and known in the planetary system as the earth."

Berlin is in possession of a shorthand writer with a unique specialty. He attends all funerals of prominent persons and takes down verbatim the addresses of the officiating clergymen. Then he prepares highly ornamented copies of the addresses and sells them to the friends of the eulogized dead. His business is so good that he has found it necessary to engage a staff of assistants.

The "Mexican Herald" tells of an exciting scene witnessed in the Romita ring during a bull fight on bicycles. Two of the chulos placed the banderillos, or short stabbing sticks, into the neck of the bulls. When the second bull entered the ring, Jose Basurto, manoeuvring his bicycle cleverly, placed the sticks with great daring, while his comrade copped sat on his wheel, which was propped to stand upright in the center of the ring. Luckily, the bull paid no attention to him.

In Lower California there is a colony of outlaws, including some of the most noted escaped criminals who operated during the latter half of the nineteenth century. They live in a strange, rugged stretch of country, with the Gulf of California on one side and a range of foothills which spread down toward the Mexican border on the other. There are no ports at this point on the coast of California, and no railroads reaching in from the other direction, so the men are pretty well isolated. They are practically prisoners, but as they do no harm nobody has troubled to interfere with them.

Arrangements are being made by a Mr. Robinson of New York for a round-the-world trip on a motor car. It is proposed that the tour shall start from Calais about May, 1902. Moscow will be taken in via Paris and Berlin. Thence the route will follow the great Siberian Railway to Vladivostok, when ship will be taken to Japan. This interesting country will be traversed, and the party will re-ship to America. No difficulty is anticipated in crossing the American Continent, though up to the present no one has accomplished the feat. At New York passage will be taken for Liverpool; from there the run will be to Dover, when the tour will conclude.

"Fifty casks of a special design and the strongest possible construction," says the "Youth's Companion," will soon be sent to Behring Sea by the United States Revenue Marine Service, and placed upon the highest hummock of the foe ice. It is hoped by tracing their future course to test the direction of the currents that cross the polar regions. The casks are twenty-eight inches long and sixteen inches in diameter, pointed at the ends and painted black, so as to be seen easily. Inside of each are directions printed in several different languages, asking the finder to write to the nearest United States consul, giving the latitude and longitude in which the cask was found, and the date.

Purveyor by Appointment to His Majesty the Cat.

Those of the public who may imagine that there is no room for initiative and ingenuity in the cats' meat trade, says the London "Chronicle," are vastly mistaken. In Kensington an enterprising young fellow is said to be making a fortune through the happy idea of supplying, on request, fish instead of meat for the cats on his round. 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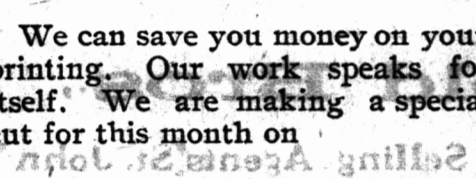
