CELEBRATION AT TIGNISH

Tignish on Monday last (postponed on Thursday, the 14th, on account of storm) joyously celebrated the signing of the armistice terms. The day was cold but nevertheless over one thousand people assembled in front of the grand stand erected for the occasion in front of the R. C. Church, at 2 p. m., when a parade was organized. At 2.15 the general marshal, Mr. J. A. Brennan, assisted by Messrs J. J. Morris, P. M. Evans, J. A. Bernard and W. C. Gaudet, formed in the following order: The flags of all allied nations, school children with flags and bunting; members of the Red Cross with banner; large float representing, by the eight young ladies thereon, Liberty, Mrs. Claude Murphy; Peace, Miss Annie Morrisey; Ireland, Miss Mary Kirch; Great Britain, Miss Anna McInnis; Belgium, Miss Winnie Gaudet; France, Miss May Bernard; Canada, Miss Margaret Kinch; Scotland, Miss Kathleen Brennan; decorated autos. The procession paraded in the principal streets and was cheered and cheered.

Buildings were patriotically decorated, flags and bunting being used in profusion on every building of the village. After the parade the people assembled once more in front of the grand stand, when the chairman proclaimed a public holiday for the afternoon then the Rev. S. J. MacDougall was presented to the audience. The reverend gentleman made some appropriate remarks and intoned the TeDeum, which was sung by the members of the R. C. Church who were present, the church bells ringing meantime. After the chanting of the Te Deum, the honor roll of Tignish was read. The roll of honor is a decorative piece of work due to the artistic abilities of Miss Alma K. Buote, and will be suitably framed and placed in the R. C. Church of Tignish. (Copies of it can be had by applying to Miss Buote). It was Mr. W. A. Gaudet who read the roll of honor. When the names of the eight who

have made the supreme sacrifice were read, all the assembly uncovered, showing due respect to the heroes. The following program was then successfully carried out:

Address, Mgr. D. M. McFadyen; chorus, Rule Britannia, the British flag waving. Address, Rev. Mr. Harding; chorus, O Canada, Canadian flag waving. Address, Rev. Mr. Crow; chorus, My Country 'Tis of Thee, American flag waving.

Address, Mr. A. J. McFadyen; Belgian flag waving and cheers. Here the chairman, addressing the audience in French and English asked for cheers for Foch, which were readily and enthusiastically given.

Address, Dr. McBride; cheers for Canadian soldiers. Address, Benj. Gallant, M. L. A., cheers for British Navy.

Address, J. A. Bernard; cheers for Tignish soldiers. Address, J. A. Morris; cheers for the Red Cross Society of Tignish. God Save Our King. Adjournalment until 7 p. m.

At 7 p. m. over four hundred people assembled in Tignish Hall where choruses, speeches, recitations, cheers, royal salute, more cheering and more speeches took place occupying over two hours. The event came to a close by singing God Save the King.
