

SIX KILLED BY EXPLOSION.

GREENWOOD SPRINGS, Col., September 17.—A terrific explosion of gas in the Spring Gulch mine of the Colorado Fuel and Iron Company, 18 miles from this place, caused the death of six miners, and the injury of three others, besides much damage to the tunnel in which the explosion occurred.
