THAT NEW CHIMNEY.

The Market House has several chimneys, and is to have another. One or more of those which were built with the building has gone on strike and refuses to "draw." Evidently the naughty thing scorns to be useful and will remain simply ornamental. Or, it has decided opinions as to the smoking habit. Or it is looking after the interest of the chimney swallows. It's curious about chimneys. Masons will tell you that you may build two exactly alike, same height, same size of flue, same sort of fire-place, same kind of mantel, every curve the same, just as many bricks in each, same sort of top, and one will draw like a twenty mule team while the other will pour all the smoke out into the room where the fire is. It is debatable whether a smoking chimney or a scolding wife is the greater ill in life, but if the latter grieves the heart the most it is certain that the former causes more tears to flow. Some chimneys won't draw with the wind blowing from the north-east, but pull well enough when the weather vane points to any other quarter. But with the east chimney of the Market House it is simply in case of downright refusal in all weathers and at morning, noon or night.

INCOMES AND SALARIES.

According to the New York Times \$1300 is the average lawyer's yearly income there but there are twelve who have incomes of \$200,000 each. The general average income of architects is about the same as lawyers, and some of them also receive as much as \$200,000 a year each. Six physicians of New York receive \$125,000 each, while the average income is \$2,000. One artist makes \$75,000 a year and newspaper artists average about \$50 per week. The average church pastor in the Republic gets \$700, and the highest salary paid (one only) is \$25,000. Two thousand dollars is the average for college professor, and fourteen university presidents together receive less than a single insurance president. One cartoonist receives \$75,000 a year and two others pocket from \$12,000 to \$20,000 each.

MR. FULL AND THE CAR FERRY.

G. E. Full has a characteristic letter in The Patriot of last evening. We will not say it is a wise letter. Rather it may be called a "fullish" one. His attack upon The Guardian we need not notice further than to say that this journal has been from the first in accord with the Board of Trade, the Provincial Convention and the Legislature in its advocacy of improved winter communication. Mr. Full knows what efforts were made to induce the Board of Trade, the Convention and the Legislature to take up the car ferry project and with what result. He knows under what limitations and restrictions he accompanied the Government delegation to Ottawa. He knows with how much earnest personal solicitation he secured the signatures to the memorial of which he boasts. Perhaps he does not know what some of the signers have said as to their reasons for signing. But let that pass. When he speaks of "a clergyman and an editor pitting themselves against the men who are carrying on the business of the country" and "having the glory of shouting for the Tunnel" he certainly does not strengthen his case. In the light of facts above only hinted at he makes himself ridiculous. Our sole desire is that all who wish to see our communications improved shall work together harmoniously to carry forward a well considered plan and not be diverted by a side issue which can do no good but may be fruitful of harm.
