Currencies

NEW YORK, Dec. 21 (AP)—The British pound staged a comeback in late dealings today after early unsteadiness. The pound ended 5-8 cent higher at 4.66 7-8 in terms of the United States dollar.

Foreign exchange dealings were still limited, bankers pointed out. The French franc advanced .00 1-2 of a cent to 2.63 3-4 while the Swiss franc dipped .01 cent, the belga and guilder were unchanged. The Canadian dollar lost 1-32 cent to a discount of 1 1-32 per cent.

MONTREAL, Dec. 21 (CP)—Trends changed on Montreal foreign exchanges late today and found Sterling firm 9-16 of a cent to close at \$4.71 21-32 after showing an early loss. The United States dollar eased 1-32 to one per cent premium while French francs advanced narrowly to 2.66 1-4 cents.

MONTREAL, Dec. 21 (CP)—Quebec and western butter prices eased fractionally on open produce markets here today while other products remained unchanged and steady, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported.

Creamery butter prints to retailers were 22 1-2-23 and solids 22-22 1-2. Western butter delivered in Montreal was offered at 21 1-2 for regraded. Que. No. 1 pasteurized butter in wholesale jobbing lots was 21 3-8 for regraded.

Graded egg shipments in used free cases were offered at 38 cents a dozen for A-large, 28 for A-medium, 28 for A-pullets, 24-25 for B-large and 21 1-2 for C.

Mixed Trends On Montreal Marts

MONTREAL, Dec. 21 (CP)—The stock market was in a preliminary mood today and prices drifted into mixed trends.

A little later demand lifted Dominion Bridge a point to 36 while Canada Cement and United Steel strengthened fractionally. A point loss, however, came out in Foundation Company at 12 while building products eased narrowly. Oils were unchanged to slightly better.

Papers backed off the way, with St. Lawrence Paper preferred off more than two points to 40 while Bathurst, Price Brothers and Howard Smith gave up fractions. In metals, Smelters and Noranda firmed narrowly while Nickel and Hudson Bay closed slightly lower.

In arrears fractionally were Canadian Car preferred, National Steel Car gained 3-4.
