MR. BORDEN AS A LEADER.

The Toronto News, which is widely read and carries weight as an independent journal, comes to the rescue of Mr. Borden as a leader. It points out that he is now criticised as a failure, just as Mr. Laurier or Mr. Whitney was when they were in opposition. They developed fine talents for leadership since their promotion to power, and why may not Mr. Borden do the same? It may be that their leadership while in the cold shades of opposition was freer from mistakes than that of Mr. Borden, but let that pass.

The News finds that Mr. Borden is growing in the confidence of the country and in acceptance as a party leader. "He has both force and reserve, and in grasp of a question and power of lucid statement no man in Parliament except perhaps Sir Richard Cartwright, is his equal." The News adds:
"It is possible for Mr. Borden to be popular and yet to be Premier. It is possible to be fair and courteous, and yet to be vigorous, aggressive and determined. Even now Mr. Borden is striking harder and with a freer hand; with less of concern for the reactionary forces in his party and a keener sympathy for the progressive spirit and democratic temper of a young, growing and confident country. It is clear that he is aiming to unite the progressive element with the old Tory faction of his party, and it must be remembered that he has gone further in the announcement of progressive principles than has any party leader in the history of the country."

There is little wonder that the New England and the Northwest are prospering when we think how many thrifty Islanders are there.

There are eighty by electors that should take place before Parliament meets. These are, East Elgin, Nicolet, St. Mary's, St. Johns-Berville, North Bruce, North Renfrew and Queen's-Shelburne. Of these seats five were last held by Liberals and three by Conservatives. No material gains in the aggregate, certainly nothing to greatly effect the relative strength of parties is to be looked for in these elections. We are told that Speaker Sutherland has taken legal advice as to whether he can issue his writ for Queens-Shelburne before the appeal on the personal charges against Mr. Fielding is determined. The point seems doubtful, and it is important, as in view of the tariff revision at the coming session. Mr. Fielding's presence in the commons is highly desirable.

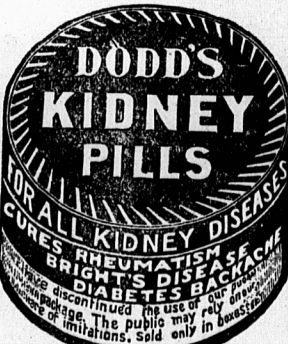
A CONSTITUTION FOR CHINA.

The announcement comes from Peking that the Chinese Government has decided to give the people of that Empire a constitution. For thousands of years, antecedating by centuries the oldest European states, China has been administered despotically by monarchs whose only limitations were their own will. Now it is proposed to define by a written instrument a form of constitutional Government in Europe, America and Japan the nations have constitutions. China now proposes to adopt the like method, very much, we presume as the Shah of Persia now pines for a Parliament.

But the way will be long before European or American methods of constitutional rule are perfected in China. No one of her four hundred millions of people has ever cast a vote. Corruption is a rank growth in Chinese officialdom. The people of one Province in China know little of those in another Province and care as little for them as for foreigners.

But they are intelligent, and some day in the future they will claim a potential voice in the law-making and administration of their vast country. With China, Russia and Persia moving in the matter of constitutional Government, how long will India remain quiet?

It is understood that the Provincial Government at its recent session decided to erect a new Poor House next spring on the Government Farm. Plans and specifications will be got ready in the meantime. The site of the present Poor House is the property of the federal Government, and may at some time in the not distant future be required for military purposes. The Provincial Government would therefore not be warranted in expending money on new buildings there. They have, however, recently had a bath room with hot and cold water fitted up, in the house—a much needed and valuable improvement.

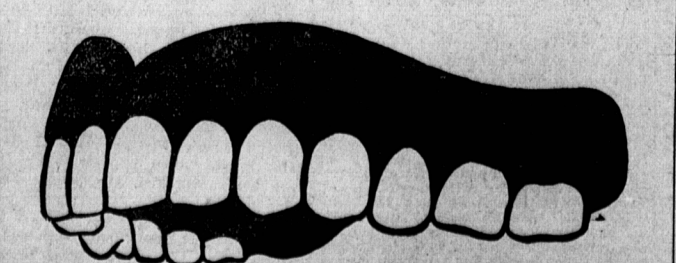

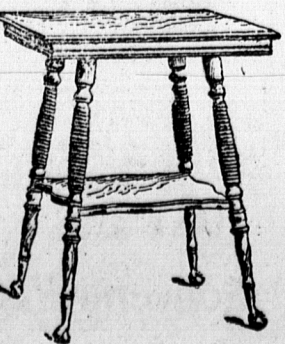
HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY one numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 20, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section of 160 acres more or less.
Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.
Entries must be made personally at the local and office for the district in which the land is situated.
A homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:
(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
(2) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land reserved for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.
(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.
Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.
