LONDON ENGINEER RESIGNS

LONDON, Oct. 19.—George Wright, engineer of the city of London for the past three years, resigned today, and in an eight-page letter alleges interference with the affairs of his department. The letter criticises Mayor Gramen.

Mr. Wright came here from Toronto and has held important posts with the municipality there. His father is a resident of Toronto at the present time. By the drowning of his uncle on the Titanic he inherited about \$12,000. At the present time the engineer is at Gravenhurst, suffering from a general breakdown as a result of working in the water when the city was threatened by flood. He is the only engineer the city ever had that made a personal inspection of the interior of the sewers.

NEW YORK'S BUDGET

NEW YORK, Oct. 19.—The New York city budget for 1913 will probably exceed \$200,000,000, the largest in the history of the city. Members of the budget committee were quoted today as saying that the figures would be "in the neighborhood of a round two hundred millions." Last year's budget was \$189,000,000.

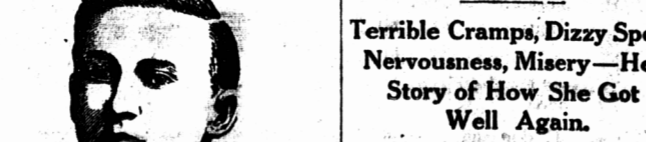

### AMERICAN SCHOONER LOST

YARMOUTH, October 19.—The American fishing schooner Harvester, Captain Fred Prime, of Eastport, Me., is a total loss in Yarmouth Sound. She struck Cat Rock this morning and evidently grounded her bottom right out. She is now lying on her broadside, full of water and tugs are stripping her of her gear. She had sixty thousand pounds of fish on board, all of which is lost. The schooner came in for supplies yesterday morning, got under way to return to the grounds shortly before three this morning in a dense fog. In beating out of the Sound she struck on the rock. A heavy swell was running in from sea and in a very few minutes she had torn great holes in her bottom and had rolled over on her side. The crew were forced to abandon her in their dories and were later picked up by the tug Freddie V. The Harvester is twenty years old and was built in Essex, Mass. and was owned by the master. She registered 106 tons and was fully insured. The crew will be sent to Boston tonight by the American consul.

### TO SOLVE AN OLD TIME MYSTERY.

WALKERTON, Ont., Oct. 19.—This little town is about to see the solving of an old mystery, which concerns the burial of John Haag, the only murderer ever hanged in Bruce. The tale is as sensational as the escape from the Paris Tombs of Jean Valjean. In February, 1868, it seems, a man named Stephen Neubecker, while returning from Seaforth with the proceeds from a load of grain he had sold, was robbed and murdered near Formosa by a man who jumped into his sleigh and battered his head with a club. John Haag was convicted of the crime and hanged on December 15th. After being taken from the gallows the body was placed in a coffin and given to Gason, caretaker of the cemetery for burial. Several years afterwards the sexton told that the rope had never done its work and that the body had come into his hands alive. He stoutly maintained that an empty casket was lowered into the grave and that the supposed corpse walked out of the cemetery. The murderer is alleged to have been seen afterwards tending bar in a Detroit saloon. The proposed sale of the old burial ground to A. E. Sherington, whose farm it adjoins, and the consequent order that has gone forth for the removal of the bodies interred there, will afford an opportunity to discover what credence can be placed in the old sexton's story.

APPLES AND ONIONIA.

A medical writer declares that the apple is such a common fruit that very few persons become familiar with its medicinal properties. The best thing just before going to bed he says is to eat an apple.
