Bright Spots Of The Week

(By The Canadian Press) (By Guardian's Special Writer) WINDSOR, Ont.—Sealed Power Piston Ring Corporation of Muskegon, Michigan, will open a plant here and expect to be in production by January 1.

PORT ARTHUR, Ont.—Ahtibi Pulp and Paper Company Mill here, long in idleness, will be re-opened at once, the company announces.

MONTREAL—C. P. R. net earnings for October \$4,100,879, up \$42,232 from October, 1933 net and C. N. R. \$2,809,429, up \$256,844.

HAMILTON, Ont.—Sherwood Porcelain Company plans to open here, manufacturing low-tension insulators, employing about 25 people at start.

K. N. S.—New \$200,000 canning plant to be erected here which will employ about 100 people.

HULL, Que.—Negotiations opened for establishment of cotton factory in Hull by U. S. concern to cost about \$600,000.

When two Negroes marry, the whole tribe is assembled and the affianced pair climb two trees growing close to each other. The branches of the trees are then bent by the elders till the heads of the couples meet, and when the bride's awareness of the solemnity of the act and the bridegroom's is declared legal, the marriage is declared legal.
