EXPORTS STOPPED - After reviewing the estimated production figures of the 1945 barley crop and the carryover from the 1944 crop, it is considered essential in order to protect the agricultural live-stock program, the entire crop to be held for Canadian consumption, says the Federal Minister of the Agricultural Supplies Board and the Wartime Prices and Trade Board.

Consequently, no further export permits will be granted for barley, whole, ground or processed.
