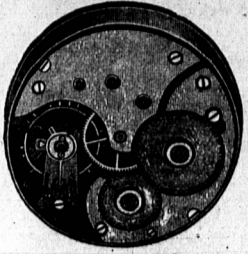

The steamer Louisburg, owned by the Dominion Coal Company, Capt Gould, ran aground at Three Rivers, Que., early Tuesday morning. She was on her way from Sydney to Montreal with a cargo of coal. It is expected the steamer will be able to get off without any serious damage.

The firm of S. B. Miller & Co., wholesale commission dealers of No 7 Fulton Market, New York, are soliciting consignments of fresh fish making a specialty of smelts and eels. Island fishermen should write this firm before making their fall shipments. S. B. Wiley & Sons, Boston Mass, are their transfer agents.

SAYS the Halifax Coast Guard—Schr. Hazel Glen, Capt. Chas. Anderson, arrived here on Thursday from Prince Edward Island, with a load of produce, and docked for discharging. Next morning at high tide, it was discovered, the vessel was about half full of water, though she was perfectly tight when brought to the wharf. She had on board 300 bushels of potatoes, 500 bushels of turnips, a quantity of oats. Carcasses of hogs and about half the potatoes in the hold were wet. The cargo was insured to the amount of \$1300. A survey, called at once, advised sale of potatoes proceed in the interest of all concerned. It was found the vessel had simply sprung a leak without damage to her bottom.

JAMES WILSON ROBERTSON, whose resignation as Commissioner of Agriculture has been reported, was born at Dnnap, Ayrshire, Scotland, Nov. 2, 1857, and is the son of John Robertson by his wife Mary Wilson. After serving in a commercial house in Glasgow he came to Canada in 1875 and embarked almost immediately in the business of cheese-making. At once his skill became noted and nine years later he was manager of eight large cheese factories in Ontario. In 1883 he was appointed professor of dairying in the Ontario agricultural college and, in 1890, he was appointed dairy commissioner and agriculturist to the central experiment farm maintained by the dominion government at Ottawa. He was also honorary resident lecturer of Dairy Husbandry at Cornell University, New York, 1888 to 1890. The mammoth cheese exhibited at the World's Fair in 1893 was manufactured under his supervision. Prof. Robertson has accomplished many noteworthy and important results in connection with his office one of which is the general introduction of the system of making ensilage into Ontario and the other provinces. In 1897 he was appointed honorary secretary of the provincial committee for establishing a fund in connection of the Victorian order of nurses in Canada. In the same year he departed on a mission to Great Britain for the purpose of bringing before the boards of trade, chambers of commerce and produce and provision exchanges, in a few of the large cities the improved transportation facilities provided by the government for the carriage of Canadian food products to the British markets. An adherent of the Presbyterian church he married in May, 1896, Jennie, only daughter of John Mather of Ottawa. Mr. Robertson's career since 1893 is familiar history to the people of Canada.

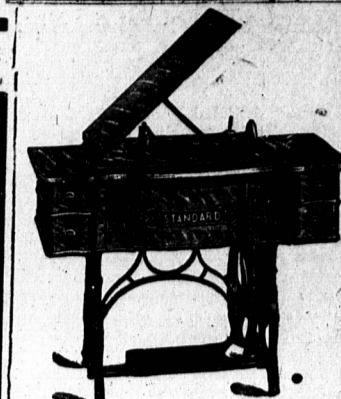
