## SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

September 20.

THE JUDGMENT OF THE NATIONS

LESSON, Matthew xxv. 31-46.

GOLDEN TEXT, Matthew xxv. 45.

"Then shall He answer them saying, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did it not unto one of these least, ye did it not unto me."

### THE NARRATIVE.

The lesson for today is the last section of the Olivet prophecy, and it is by no means an easy one to deal with. There have been many interpretations, and as these notes are written for teachers, I cannot refrain from saying that I think it very unwise to take a lesson like this among children. However, it is necessary that we do so.

Let it be observed, then, that the first words are, "When the Son of man shall come in His glory." The Son of man is peculiarly the title which refers to our Lord in His earthly relationships and administration. A glance back at the previous section of the prophecy will show that the title is not found there at all. Still speaking to His disciples, our Lord was looking beyond the darkness of the passion which He was approaching, to the light of the ultimate fulfilment of His purpose, so far as this world is concerned. It is important, therefore, that we should observe the events exactly as they are described for us here, and in order to the greater clearness it is important that we should recognize that there is no reference here to that final assize associated with the great white throne which is described in the Apocalypse. In that hour earth and heaven will be fled a way. The dead will be raised for judgment. Here there is no passing away of the earth, and the dead are not seen.

The Son of man is enthroned as King of the world. He assumes the reigns of actual and immediate administration, in which He is to be assisted by the angels that have accompanied Him. The process of that beginning of administration is then described.

described. It is first that of gathering together the nations. The emphasis here is upon this thought of the gathering of them, which means the changing of all the old conditions. The language is patiently figurative, and it is not at all necessary to conjure up before the imagination a picture of all the population of the world assembled in one place. The nations as such are gathered together when their representatives are gathered together.

The second process is that of a new division, separating between goats and sheep; to use the still figurative language of the parable itself. The separating test is that of the attitude of these nations toward the brethren of the Lord. This again must be interpreted by Himself and His mission, and the things He had said in the earlier part of His ministry. In the course of that ministry He had clearly declared that those who do the will of God constituted His next of kin. The nations, then, are to be divided according to the reception they have given to their ministry and message. We may rest assured that no final national verdict will be found on this basis until the nations have all had full opportunity of standing in the presence of the test suggested.

This finding of a verdict is followed by the passing of a sentence. That sentence must be interpreted only by the whole scene and its relationships. The blessed are to go away into age-abiding fire, which, as age-abiding punishment. The life in to which the blessed go is life on this earth. The punishment into which the cursed go is punishment on this earth. Beyond these, things we have no right to go in any interpretation of this parable.

THE TEACHING. Again, as we turn from the things which are admittedly difficult of interpretation to the central value of our lesson, we find it in the picture presented of the Lord Himself. Sitting on the mount of Olives in the midst of his disciples, He knew perfectly well all that was waiting for Him in the immediate future. Judged by all the common human standards, He was defeated, and His defeat, so His enemies thought, was a blot to be ensured and made irrevocable by His death. Yet in the midst of such circumstances, He is seen, calmly surveying the coming centuries understanding all their relationships and all facts concerning them, and looking through to the

end so far as this earth is concerned claiming the victory. He is heard speaking without the slightest hesitation of that ultimate hour in which He will come and sit upon the throne of glory and with absolute authority and almighty power administer the affairs of the Kingdom of God.

His view-point of the nations should be ours. In this last stage of the great prophecy He looked far beyond the ancient people of God, and beyond the Church itself, taking in all the nations so should we see the nations of the world today, no longer separated by the dividing lines of race and language and locality, but by the spiritual lines of their relationship to the Son of man, as for the present He is manifested through His brethren, who are his messengers. We should see them also as messengers. We should see them also as called into the Kingdom of God—so far as His counsel and will are concerned; and therefore as all yet to be judged by the answer they give to that call.

Standing thus in the presence of our Lord, and listening to Him, we rest assured of the certainty of the issue of everything which sometimes appears to be full of uncertainty and difficulty.
