YESTERDAY'S snowstorm followed by colder weather last night will no doubt make navigation difficult for the Northumberland today.

THE following schooners are in port for the winter: Torridon, Restiva, Lois, Ida, M. Joseph McGill, Western Light, Malabar, Jennie Armstrong and Telephone.

THE storm during the past few days brought winter in real earnest. Early yesterday morning the thermometer at the meteorological station here registered six below zero with a strong north westerly wind blowing. The harbor which had been quite full of lolly was frozen solid. The Northumberland on account of the storm has not moved from the wharf since Sunday. Captain Cameron had hopes to make a trip to P. du Chese yesterday as the indications on the previous day were that soft weather would follow the snow storm, but instead the wind shifted to the northwest and the night set in unusually cold. It was then decided to steam for Charlottetown but up to last night the storm prevented this and it is doubtful if today it will be possible for the steamer to get out as the zero weather continues and the ice is making fast. The Stanley is not yet here to take up the winter service and consequently since Sunday we are without communication with the Mainland.

The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held Monday night, the Mayor and all the Councilors except Coun. Morrison being present. Coun. Sinclair for the committee on the light question asked for further time in which to bring in a report. The time was extended one week.

Albert Gaudet's salary as street commissioner was fixed at \$1.25 a day.

A deputation from the Citizens' League waited upon the Council re the matter of the enforcement of the C. T. A. J. A. Brace first addressed the Council referring to the Mayor's remarks at the last annual citizen's meeting stating that the temperance people were spasmodic in their efforts, and under that proof he (Mr. Brace) thought they were doing better. He referred to good evidence having been offered the prosecutor which was not accepted; that the liquor traffic was worse than a license law.

John Morrison in addressing the Council confined his remarks to what he considered was the most vital question just now, viz, the matter of a conviction for third offense before the Supreme Court not being settled. The league would like to know why the law is not enforced.

Councillor Clark in a somewhat lengthy speech mentioned that as the matter of an appeal which was asked for on the case was on the part of the defendant, and as they were no further ahead than at the time conviction was obtained he thought the Council had waited long enough and that the judgment of the lower Court should be carried out. Coun. Morris took a different view of the matter and thought that as the question of appeal was taken into consideration by the judge and in as much as a decision had not been given, that the prosecution should employ counsel to enquire into the matter.

After a somewhat heated discussion chiefly between Couns. Clark and Morris, Coun. Clark moved that the C. T. A. conviction for the offence against Frank Perry be enforced. The motion was seconded by Coun. Mulart.

Coun. Sinclair moved in amendment that the town employ counsel to enquire as to how the Perry case stands.

The amendment was carried on the votes of Couns. Sinclair, Morris and Dickieson.
