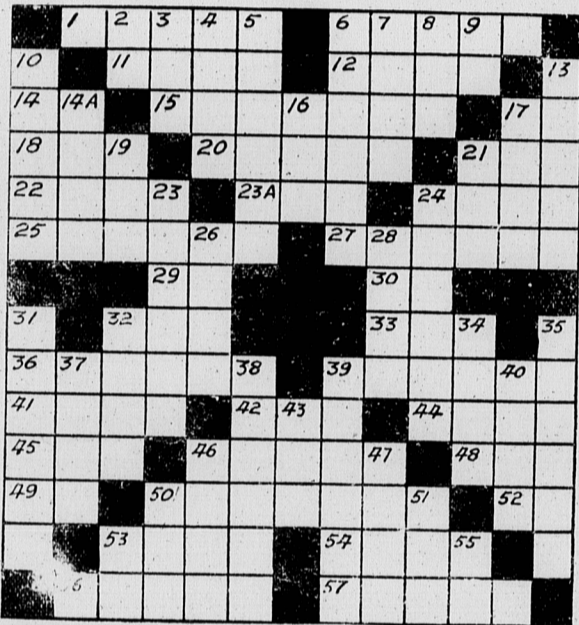

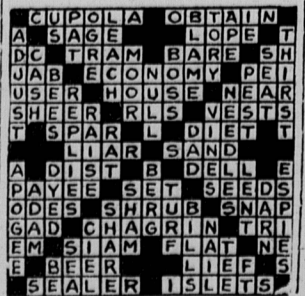

P. W. C. DEBATE

The first meeting of the P.W.C. Debating Society since the College reopened, was held on Tuesday, March 24. "Resolved that the white race has conferred more ill than blessings on the other nations of the world" was the subject under discussion. The speakers on the pro side, led by Miss Anna MacDonald, gave many convincing arguments in favor of the resolution. Miss Madeline Clarkin, leader of the con side, showed how the other nations of the world had adopted the customs and habits of the white peoples, and in so doing, had been greatly benefited as the white races were the most civilized and the most advanced in the arts and sciences in the world. At an early hour yesterday morning Mrs. James Payne, of Charlottetown, passed to her eternal rest. She had reached the venerable age of four score years and one, and at the time of her demise had been living in St. Francis Hostel on Sydney Street. For some months past she had been growing feebler in health, and had been confined to her room.

The late Mrs. Payne came to Nova Scotia with her parents from Ireland at the tender age of three years. They resided in Nova Scotia until the opening of the Prince Edward Island Railway in 1875 when they came to Prince Edward Island, Mr. Payne bringing the train across the Straits for the contract of the Railway.
