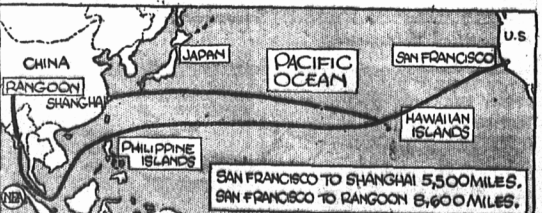
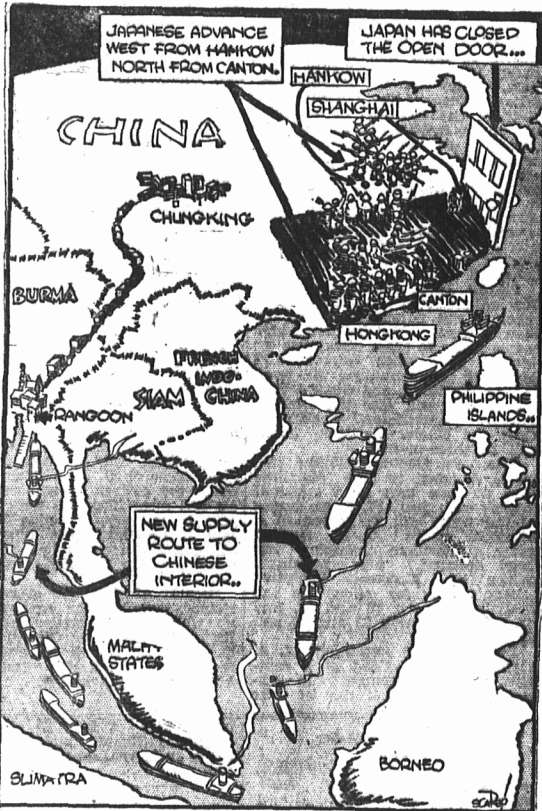

## China's New War Supply Route



Showing how supplies are moving to China's hard-pressed armies, nearly isolated in the interior now that the Japanese have gained control of most of the Chinese coast and the vital Yangtze river. Reports are the U. S. government's \$20,000,000 loan to a Chinese-controlled New York company will finance purchase of automobile trucks and gasoline. These would go to the Chinese front lines by way of Rangoon and Chungking. Lower map shows difference in distances from San Francisco.

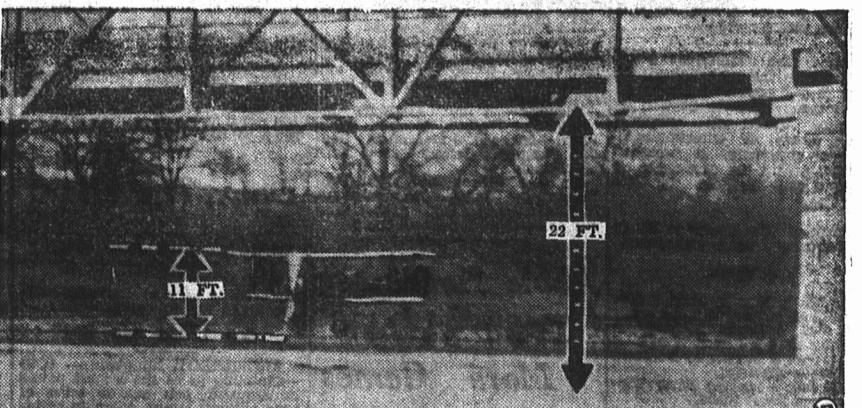

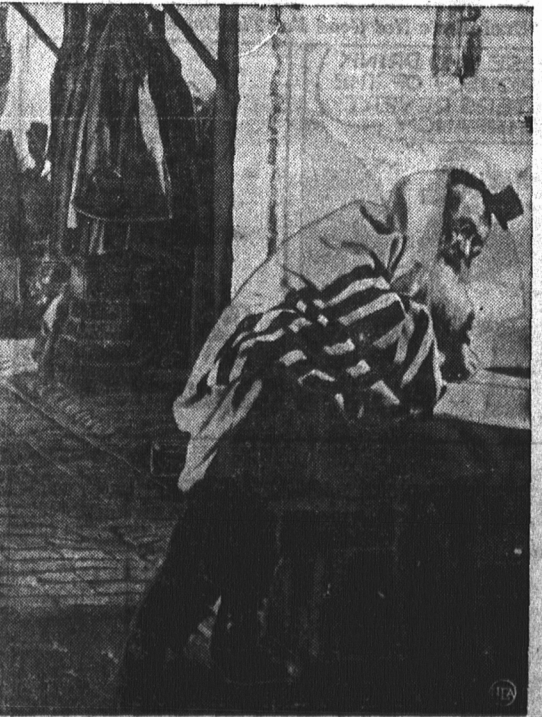
The British Navy's newest submarine Trident, a 1,090-ton craft is shown entering the water at the launching at Birkenhead, Cheshire, a few days ago.
