Sporting Comment

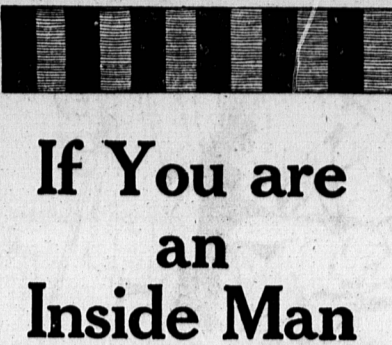
