Deputy Mayor Named For Summerside

A special meeting of the Summerside town council was held last evening with Deputy Mayor D. F. MacNeill presiding in the absence of the Mayor W. J. Lidstone.

A resolution was passed on motion of Councillor Morrison, that a letter be sent to the Summerside Youth Centre Inc. asking them to give the senior ball club week of the annual diatribe for three nights a week and requesting that both organizations get together and endeavor to settle the matter between them. This motion was moved after some discussion.

Councillor Gorrill had brought the matter up. He said he understood that the senior club was not to have the diamond since the town had turned over use of the S. Y. C. I. Councillor Wedge said that arrangements had been made between the two organizations that the senior club could use the diamond three nights a week and the younger boys could use it the other three nights. The young boys did not get much benefit from it as the older players were using it six nights a week.

Councillor Gorrill said he had been informed that the ball club would have had to build a backstop and turn over half of the proceeds of games to the S. Y. C. I. Now there is no ball of any kind.

Handed to S. Y. C. I.—Councillor Morrison asked if the ball park had been handed over to the S. Y. C. I. Councillor Gorrill said, "yes." Councillor Morrison said that the town would not sell land but they will give it away. Ball had been played there for over twenty-five years and should be served to the town.
