CHAN FILM DUE AT LOCAL THEATRE

In "Sky Dragon", the latest Charlie Chan mystery produced by Monogram, which opens Thursday at the Empire Theatre, the famed Chinese sleuth, portrayed by Roland Winters, is faced with one of the most difficult cases in his long and brilliant career.

Chan and his "Number One son," Keve Luke, are aboard a plane when the passengers and crew are drugged, a shipment of \$25,000 is stolen, and the guard is murdered.

MIDNIGHT PICK-UP STARTS DRAMATIC NARRATIVE OF "PICCADILLY INCIDENT"

A midnight pick-up leading to 72 hours of ecstasy, then three years of waiting and hoping, starts the gripping and provocative story of "Piccadilly Incident," now showing at the Prince Edward Theatre.

It is the story of a GI bride in reverse - an American Red Cross worker who marries a British officer and who faces a dramatic choice when his supposedly dead wife returns to her husband.

Co-starring England's top-ranking team of Anna Neagle and Michael Wilding, "Piccadilly Incident" is no pipe dream. The tender yet tragic romance, in which American-born Frances Mercer plays Wife No. 2, is based on an actual conversation overheard during a wartime blackout. Records in England and America prove that such "incidents" have happened and are still happening in both countries. Unfortunately, they don't all turn out as happily as this film.

Highlighted with the humor which American audiences have come to expect in British films, "Piccadilly Incident" is not a war story but a simple tale of the kind of people who live next door. English movie-goers voted it the best picture of the year and awarded Miss Neagle the Picturegoer Award, the equivalent of Hollywood's "Oscar."
