MEETING P.E.I. BAPTIST CONFERENCE

Good Attendance And Inter- esting Resolutions Passed Deacon Ordained To Office

The regular quarterly session met with the Summerside Baptist Church on Feb. 25th. It was a great joy to all to meet in the beautiful new house of worship built on the site of the one destroyed by the great fire in Summerside about a year and a half ago. Eighteen delegates representing ten churches were present. Rev. I. W. Porter, Supt. of Baptist Home Mission for N.S. and P.E.I. was present and was cordially invited to a seat. A very profitable feature of the conference was the devotional services conducted by Revs. W. B. Crowell, F. N. Atkinson, and S. H. Cornwall. A very interesting and profitable address on Home Missions was delivered by Rev. I. W. Porter. There were papers by Revs. E. A. McPhee and F. N. Atkinson on "What of the future of our Baptist Churches, and how can we help to make that future?" and "Should our Churches be sustained even in face of loss and the general tendency toward Union?" respectively. Both were practical and optimistic, and received much favorable comment.

Rev. W. M. Field preached a very helpful sermon from 1 Cor. 1:21-24. Offerings for denominational work amounted to \$7.69. The financial statement of deacon A. W. Sterns for half year ending Jan. 31st, '08, showed that nearly six hundred dollars have been paid in by our churches for the various enterprises of the denomination.

Considerable time was spent in discussing the needs of our Mission Fields, and as a result some re-arranging of groups is likely to take place. It was resolved to recommend to the H. M. Board that the grant of thirty-five dollars to the Bonshaw Church be continued if needed. Owing to changes anticipated on the Hazelbrook, Uigg Field, the following resolutions were passed:—That this Conference endorse the proposed division of the Hazelbrook—Uigg Field, and advise that the Home Mission Board grant to Uigg and Belfast churches a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars to assist in supporting a pastor. It was decided to approve the "Denominational Day" idea, i.e. the taking of offerings for our work, according to the rotation schedule on the fifth Sunday in months having five Sundays. The offerings on fifth Sunday in March will be for Home Missions.

An interesting ceremony not on the program took place on the afternoon of the 26th, when Bro. J. Spurgeon Burns was ordained to the office of deacon in the Summerside Baptist Church. A sermon on The Office of Deacon was preached by Pastor W. B. Crowell; ordaining prayer by Rev. G. R. White; laying on of hands by all the pastors and deacons present.

Program for the next meeting of Conference was submitted and approved. Time and place to be determined by the Executive.

Bills for printing and postage amounting to \$2.09 were ordered paid. An evangelistic service, conducted by Rev. S. H. Cornwall, in which many bore testimony to the saving power of God, brought to a close a very helpful and inspiring Conference. The following resolutions were passed:

Resolved:—That we express our appreciation to the Home Mission Board for sending its esteemed and efficient Supt. of Home Missions; and we thank him for his able and inspiring address on Home Missions and his timely counsel in all the deliberation of this Conference.

Resolved:—That, in view of this Conference having approved of the idea of "Denominational Day," we urge all our churches to carry out this plan by observing the fifth Sunday, according to the Rotation Schedule, for the presentation of our Denominational Work to our churches.

Resolved:—That we note with very great satisfaction the increased interest manifested by the churches in attending and supporting this Conference, and we would respectfully urge all our churches to send delegates to its quarterly session.

Resolved:—That the thanks of this Conference be tendered to Pastors Atkinson and McPhee for the valuable papers presented by them at this Conference.

Resolved:—That we note with great pleasure the growing spirit toward union among Christian Bodies, and particularly between the United Baptists and Disciples, and we earnestly pray for the time when we all shall be one.

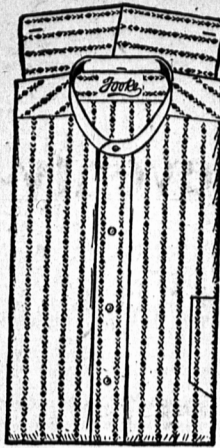

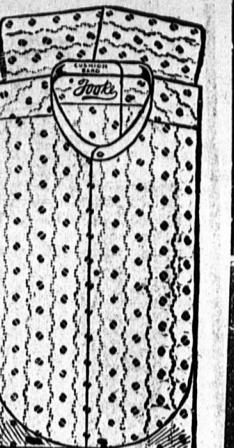
