WASHINGTON, D. C., April 29.—In the closing hours of the general debate on the Tariff Bill in the House of Representatives yesterday it became evident that the only question to be settled by the country at large is whether the imports of Canadian products under the Underwood free list will hurt the American farmer more than it will benefit the American consumer.

The frightened Republicans held up Canada as a wolf rushing down upon the fold of American farmers, while the Democrats, toss the arguments aside with this statement: "Perhaps prices on foodstuffs will fall, but the farmer, the grower of the wool and agricultural implements for farmers which will come in free, will more than offset the great Canadian produce imports."

# EUROPEAN SITUATION

LONDON, April 29.—Up to a late hour tonight the British foreign office had no news that Austria was actually taking separate action.

The meetings of the ambassadors at London have shown almost conclusively that a majority of the powers are not prepared to adopt warlike measures against Montenegro. It is thus practically certain that within a few days, whether Italy consents or not, Austria will dispatch an ultimatum to Cetinje, demanding the immediate evacuation of Scutari.

It is considered that Essad Pasha, an influential Albanian, with a strong following, and the prestige of a gallant defence of Scutari might be more acceptable to Albanians than a foreign prince, and that if allowed to retain his self-chosen pose he might be inclined to make territorial concessions which would compensate Montenegro for the loss of Scutari and satisfy European claims.

# FRIEDMANN SELLS FOR \$1,925,000

NEW YORK, April 29.—After long negotiations Dr. Friedrich Franz Friedmann has arranged for the sale of the American rights in his turtle vaccine consumption cure for \$1,925,000 in cash and \$1,800,000 in stock in thirty-six Friedrich F. Friedmann Institutes to be organized in thirty-six selected states, with a total capitalization of \$5,400,000.

The first payment to Dr. Friedmann on account was made yesterday. It consisted of a cheque for \$123,000, which will be all the cash Dr. Friedmann will receive until the fee for the treatment of patients with his turtle vaccine begin to come in.

The American firm which will undertake the marketing of the Friedmann cure is the Eisner-Mendelson Company. Under the terms of the agreement, this concern is to organize the thirty-six Friedrich F. Friedmann Institutes with a capitalization of \$150,000 each, each institute to retain \$100,000 in treasury stock and turn over to Dr. Friedmann \$50,000 in stock as his share.

The negotiations for the marketing of the Friedmann vaccine were conducted in the offices of the law firm of Leventritt, Cook & Nathan, at 111 Broadway. Dr. Friedmann was present when the negotiations terminated, but he was also represented by Carl Schurz, his personal counsel. On behalf of the Eisner-Mendelson Company, which gains control of the vaccine, the law firm of Leventritt, Cook & Nathan drew up the final form of the agreement.

# CANADIAN COLONY

## NEAR LONDON

LONDON, April 29.—During the last twelve months some hundreds of Canadian and American have settled in and around Putney Hill, Wimbledon and Richmond which are by far the most favored districts, and have become quite the centre of a Canadian and American colony. The surrounding country is beautiful. A bracing air, golf, polo, and the river offers a collection of attractions to which our trans-Atlantic visitors have willingly succumbed.

There is a probability that Quebec House, Wolfe's old home, will be acquired by Canadians in Great Britain with the object of maintaining it as a permanent memorial of the hero of Quebec. Canadian interest here has been quickened by the fact that several wealthy Americans and an English millionaire have been and indeed still are considering the purchase of the old Tudor mansion which holds so many memories dear to Canadians.

For many years Quebec House has been a centre of Wolfe traditions and associations and thousands of Canadians visit of each year. It dates from about the year 1500, a date established only a few years ago when an ornamental carved with the arms of Henry VIII, was discovered behind the oak paneling of one of the rooms.

# ADVISES CANADA TO DROP POLITICS

QUEBEC, April 29.—Speaking before the Canadian Club of Quebec on Saturday, Colonel Allen, Minister of Finance and Defence, in the New Zealand Government, who has just arrived from England, "whether he had given in that interests of his Government, advised the country to take the question of Imperial defence out of politics, as New Zealand had done, by putting patriotism before party. He knew nothing," he said, of Canadian politics and did not desire to, but he hoped the parties would get together and thus solve their difficulties. He looked forward to the day when Canada would co-operate with the other Dominions, and assured them that if ever New Zealand or Australia could help Canada they would not fail them.

Colonel Allen said it was the common duty of all the Dominions to stand by the Mother Country and help in the matter of Imperial defence in the interest of the safety and peace of the whole world. New Zealand had come to the conclusion that Imperial consolidation was necessary and nobody would be more benefited by it than the people of the province of Quebec, who had been assured their language and religion by the British flag for so many, many years. He thought it extremely doubtful if they would have enjoyed such privileges under any other flag.

All of them in New Zealand were looking to Canada, who was going to do as she occupied so important a position and what steps she would take in the matter of consolidation.

## THE TEMPERATURE

TORONTO, Ont., May 1.—Fresh winds, mostly northerly, at few scattered showers of rain or sleet chiefly in the eastern portions, but mostly fair and cool.

The temperature at three o'clock this morning by the Rexall Store tested thermometer, with a southern exposure was thirty-three degrees above zero and with a northern exposure was thirty-one above.
