# Indian Outlaw Is Still Defiant

## He Has Been Chased All Over Northern British Columbia but Cannot be Captured—His Women Are Expert With Rifles

VANCOUVER, May 27.—With an augmented party, equipped with the finest rifles and the best ammunition to be bought in the North, Simon Gagnon, the Indian murderer and outlaw, is still alive and bidding defiance to the authorities. Simon was recently reported to have perished in the fear of winter experienced in the North, but information received shows that he is about the liveliest dead Indian in all that broad northern country.

Simon's outlaw band is growing. Early in the fall Simon and his wife were joined by two members of their village, and later by the father and another of the murderer. The latest acquisitions to their party are an Indian man and woman, the former a brother of the murderer, and named Skookum-house Tom.

### DEFIED THE AUTHORITIES.

Tom, like his brother, is a fugitive on his feet. Three months ago he attempted to kill an Indian in his neighborhood. A summons was issued to bring him before the magistrate at Hazelton, but Tom did not obey, and when a warrant was placed in the hands of a constable the Indian took his wife and started for the trail.

The story that he joined his brother Simon is confirmed from his own lips. A month after his flight he returned to his native village of Kasgeas, which lies fifty miles to the north of Hazelton, with the expressed intention of burning his home and other buildings near his dwelling. He told the Indians that his brother never intended to come back, and would resist arrest to the death, for they believed they would be severely dealt with when captured. New York, May 28.—The woman who can keep a secret has been found. The secret is one of millions—\$1,000,000 to be precise. It came into the possession of a Boer woman of Kruger's gold.

She is Miss Marie von Veltheim, wife of a Boer, the man who buried crafty old Oom Paul's millions when he fled from the Transvaal just before Lord Roberts occupied Pretoria.

Miss von Veltheim had a duplicate chest on which were marked the spots where the gold was buried. It was not sunk at sea in the wreck of the Zululani as some would have it. Neither was it let down below the waters of the ocean in iron chests.

It was carefully buried in the dead of night in the mountains of the Transvaal just before Kruger escaped to Europe.

# ENGLISH AND RUSSIAN PLAUS

LONDON, May 27.—The Social Democrats of Great Britain last night welcomed their Russian comrades who have come to London for the purpose of holding a congress of official Englishmen at the Marlborough Town Hall. The surging crowds inside and outside the building soon resolved themselves into a great demonstration against an Anglo-Russian entente, and nearly all the delegates spoke in opposition to an entente between the two Governments and in favor of an understanding between the two peoples against the common foe of "despotism and repression."

The meeting was a remarkable display of the international solidarity of social Democrats. Henry Mayors Hildman, the most prominent of the English socialists, delivered an address in which he declared that English socialists were heart and soul with their Russian comrades and wished their complete victory against their universal enemies.

Of the Russian delegates M. Mishkovsky made the speech of the evening. He appealed to the British Socialists to start an agitation against the attempt that Sir Edward Grey, the foreign secretary, is now making to bring about an entente between Russia and Great Britain, which would enable English capital further to oppress the people of Russia.

"By the help of their trades unions," said M. Mishkovsky, "you will be able to force your government to refuse to Russia the gold with which to crush what is the beginning of the social revolution of the world."

# ARREARS OF TAXES

## NOTICE TO DEFAULTERS

Notice is hereby given that the Act passed by the Legislature in 1907, to provide a more speedy and simple method for the collection of Arrears of Taxes, will be put into force at once for the collection of Arrears of 1906 and all previous years. The new Act does not require proceedings to be taken against the land, the advertising of the same nor the mailing of Final Notices to Defaulters; and it gives the Government the additional power, where the Tax is one month over due, of suing in any Court, and of levying on all goods and chattels found on the premises or in possession of the party sued. Where there are no goods and chattels, or not sufficient to levy on, proceedings will be taken against the land under the old Act as heretofore.

The new Act, as well as the old, declares all taxes to be "Crown debts," having priority over all other Claims, Judgments, Mortgages, Bills of Sale etc. All Taxes will be sued for in the name of the King.

Persons in Arrears for Land, Road or Income Tax are requested to make immediate payment to save expense.
