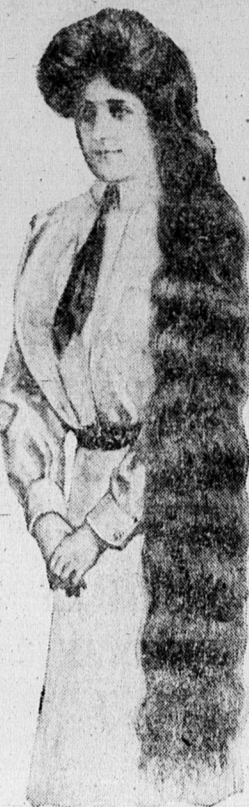

AMHERST, December 4.—The Maritime Winter Fair opened auspiciously today. The weather was good and the trains brought many visitors. The fair is represented by a crowd of students from the Agricultural college. All the departments have the entries well filled. In the beef cattle, swine and sheep classes the entries number about the same as last year, but there is a large increase in the dairy cattle class and in all lines of poultry. The poultry entries are over fifteen hundred and experts from Ottawa declare that the exhibits are the finest ever shown in Canada. The Hartland poultry company, of New Brunswick sent over three hundred entries to the show.

CHICAGO, Dec. 4.—Three brothers, ranging in age from eleven to seventeen years, were drowned Saturday afternoon when the ice broke while they were skating in what is known as the Pennsylvania slip, near East 131st street and MacKinaw avenue. The victims were Walter Cwiakale, eleven years old, and his brothers, John and Frank, nine and seven years old, respectively.

LONDON, Dec. 4.—Lord Ashton, of Ashton Hall, Lancaster, has shown a way in dealing with strikes which never has been tried successfully in England and has set an example to other employers of labor which is already being followed with success. Lord Ashton owns mills in Lancaster, in which he employs between four thousand and five thousand men and boys, and is known as a generous employer, as well as a benefactor to his workpeople.

Learning that certain agitators were endeavoring to sow discontent in his works he publicly proclaimed that at the very first symptoms of a strike he would close down his mills. He would have no dissension among his employes, and those who were not satisfied could go at once. Not only that, but he set himself to find out who the malcontents were and sent them about their business. That had



a salutary effect. The employes held a meeting and passed a resolution expressing confidence in their employer and the threatened strike was averted.

The first firm to follow Lord Ashton's example is Messrs. Smedley, Limited, of the Lea Halsey Mills, in Berkshire. Labor agitators got busy there too. Discontent was spreading among the work-people, who were beginning to imagine they were giving too much for what they got. When Messrs. Smedley intimated that the malcontents would have to quit, otherwise all would suffer from the closing of the mills, that settled it. Time was not given to the travelling agitators to breed dissension. From both these scenes of labor the agitators have disappeared, the workmen letting them understand that they had no use for them there, as they wished to be allowed to work for their employers in peace.

PARIS, Dec. 4.—France's enormous stock of antiquated rifles has been the subject of grave cogitation on the part of the budget committee. Struck by the large sums required by the French War Department for storage and maintenance of material the committee asked for a detailed statement, from which it was learned that in the French arsenals there are no fewer than 1,825,000 old service rifles and carbines which are not the slightest use in case of a mobilization, as the cartridges required for them are no longer made. They are weapons of the 1874 and 1880 patterns and have a calibre of 11 millimetres. Most of them are reported to be in "fair" condition, but more than half a million are admittedly quite useless. These are the remains of a huge accumulation of out-of-date arms that found good purchasers for a time at a dollar or two a piece among African negro tribes. But civilization has made great strides since even in the

wilds of Africa and now the African negro is as good a judge of a Mauser or a Winchester repeater as his white brother and when he has the means to pay he insists on having the best. The budget committee has now resolved that the out-of-date goods must be immediately scrapped. It is hoped that the rifle stocks will sell at something like six cents each, while the metal parts will go as old iron, so that these obsolete weapons which were once so expensive will realize no more than maybe ten cents apiece.

LONDON, Dec. 4.—The Rev. Thos. Teignmouth Short, canon of Worcester since 1891 and chaplain in ordinary to the King, died yesterday. He was born in Dublin in 1841. He was honorary chaplain to Queen Victoria in 1878, chaplain in ordinary 1881-1901, and chaplain in ordinary to King Edward VII. He was religious instructor to the daughter of King Edward.
