To Discontinue Supervision Of Playgrounds

The Summerside Youth Centre Inc. will advise the town of its intention to retire from supervising the playground at the High School, Mr. R. E. Ellis, president of that body, stated, following a directors meeting last evening. The S. Y. C. I. was formed in the fall of 1943 and incorporated by act of Legislature in February, 1944. It is a body set up by the Rotary Club, the Y's Men's Club and the Knights of Columbus and was originally organized as an effort by those organizations to combat juvenile delinquency. Its chief activity was in the setting up and equipping a playground at the High School and maintaining an athletic room in the school basement. A paid director supervised the playgrounds, and gave physical training in the school. There has been no director employed since last June.

Each of the above mentioned organizations appoint six of their members who constitute the membership of the S. Y. C. I. for one year. They elect their own officers and board of directors. There has been some indication available for another playground

that some action, such as was announced last night, might be in the offing, since a dispute this spring over the use of the baseball diamond on the school grounds. The Town Council authorized the Summerside Baseball League to use the diamond three evenings a week over the strenuous objections of the S. Y. C. I.

Mr. Ellis emphasized last night that the organization is not dissolving but is merely retiring from active participation in the athletic field. He said that at a meeting held three weeks ago a resolution was unanimously passed that the S. Y. C. I. would ask the town to take over supervision of the playground. If the town failed to respond each of the parent clubs were to be given the opportunity of taking over supervision on their own authority. If neither of these suggestions were accepted the equipment would be taken up and stored until a suitable group could be found to take the responsibility of its supervision. Mr. Ellis said that this resolution has been submitted to the three parent organizations and that the three of them has approved the action suggested, now, he said, the first plank of the platform is being acted on and the secretary will write the Town Council asking them to take over the supervision of the playground. Mr. Ellis said that there is land in the west ward and it is quite possible that if suitable persons were found to operate it that the S. Y. C. I. would raise the money to provide equipment.
