MAUSER INVENTS ANOTHER RIFLE.

OBERDERF, Wurtinberge, Aug. 17 Paul Mansor, the aged inventor of the rifle bearing his name, has invented a new military rifle, the principal feature of which is a 25 shot automatic cartridge feeder. The rifle may also be used as a single shot-piece, the barrel reloading after each shot while the magazine of 25 cartridges remain ready for an emergency. The rifle weighs but a few ounces more than the rifle now used in the German Army service.
