EVILS OF THE PARTY SYSTEM

Interesting Address by Dr. Goldwin Smith Before Canadian Club at Toronto.

TORONTO, Feb. 12.—"Party politics" was the subject treated by Dr. Goldwin Smith in a brief but very thoughtful address before the members of the Canadian Club at their weekly luncheon.

"If you were asked to propose a system of government for a new country, asked Dr. Smith, 'would you choose a system which would divide the people into two factions, and set them fighting each other for all time? In place of the party system Dr. Smith said that the people should elect their representatives on their merits and fitness, just as the directors of any commercial or social organization were chosen. These representatives should in turn select their executive. That was the system which worked admirably in Switzerland, where there were no party lines, and there was no reason why it should not work satisfactorily elsewhere. Such a system would entail a double ballot, one for nomination and one for election. One had only to look at the wholesale corruption and bad passions brought out in a United States presidential election to consider seriously whether the rule of even a despot would not be preferable to government under party system. There was no reason why Ontario should be divided by two parties. In thirty years the only important party question had been the lowering of the franchise. It was time to look the question seriously in the face when party politics in their worst form were invading municipal administration. 'My generation is passing away,' said Dr. Smith in conclusion. 'It is for you younger men to decide whether you will make party bonds your ideal or whether you will act for the great interests of the country.'

NO LONGER BAPTIST

President Harper says Chicago University Has Outgrown It—Says Denominationalism is Narrow Mindedness.

CHICAGO, January 30.—"The University of Chicago is no longer a Baptist institution. Almost in so many words, President Harper announced to the senior class today that the university had outgrown its denominational character. He declared that in the nature of its faculty, its students and its methods it had spread beyond its allegiance to the Baptist church. Most of the students and most of the professors, he said, were non-Baptists. All the buildings on the campus were paid for by the people of other creeds, and \$900 out of every \$100, except that given by John D. Rockefeller, who was a Baptist, were contributed by people not members of that church. "Religious denominationalism in universities," President Harper continued, "is narrow-mindedness, and the fact that the University of Chicago has broken away from this class is an evidence of its mental progress. Denominationalism may apply small colleges, but not to large ones."

RUSSIAN ADMIRAL MADE TWO. TURKISH MONITORS RETREAT

Czar Gave Him Highest Mark of Honor for That. He Outwitted a British Captain at Newport in 1887, and Knows How to "Bluff," Too.

It has been said that the Russian navy has no history; no tradition. The man whom report from the far east assigns to command of the fleet which will fight Japan, Skridloff, gives the lie to both sayings:

Nicholas Iarionovitch Skridloff is a bold man of the "D"—the torpedoes "I" type, with a mixture of the "Fighting Bob" Evans in his make-up. He wears the Cross of St. George, the decoration most highly prized in Russia. Verestchagin, the painter, who abhors war and always tries to be about where it is going on, tells the story of how Skridloff as a naval lieutenant won the cross for heroism in 1877.

The Russian army was preparing to cross the Danube by pontoons when two Turkish monitors appeared. There was nothing afloat to drive them off but the Czar's little yacht, the Schutka. Skridloff was ordered to take this and put the Turkish ironclads out of business.

With six sailors and Verestchagin, who was eager to go along and won permission, Skridloff on the Schutka steamed toward the monitors to torpedo them.

"Have a glass of sherry," said Skridloff to Verestchagin. "You'll never drink another, my friend."

YACHT SCARES OFF IRONCLADS. The Schutka went ahead full speed through a perfect storm of every kind of missile the Turks' guns could throw. None disabled the Schutka, and the Turks, fearing that Skridloff would get close enough to put his torpedoes to work, retreated. The way was clear for the bridge

builders. Skridloff sustained no loss than four severe wounds.

Ten years later Skridloff, as captain of the gunboat Strelak, 1,500 tons, visited Newport. Relations between Russia and England were strained at that moment to the verge of a declaration of war. A British cruiser, big enough to blow Skridloff out of the water, "happened in" at Newport and kept an eye on the Russian. Her commander was Captain Hand.

On the same cruise Skridloff sent two officers ashore for news at Santo Domingo. The local authorities arrested them at the instigation of the British consul.

Skridloff went ashore, demanded their release with a written apology, threatening to bombard the place.

"A sign from my hand and the bombardment begins," said he.

The apology was given in a hurry. Skridloff recorded the facts at the British consulate by way of good measure.

Skridloff is now sixty years old. He is a tall man of giant build. It would be hard to find a pair of broader shoulders than his in all the Russias.

OPERATIONS A FAD. GLASS PLANTS IDEL.

PITTSBURG, Feb. 10.—All the plants owned by the National Glass Co., eight in number, are idle and fully 4,000 flint glass workers, 800 of whom are skilled workers, members of the American Flint Glass Workers' Union, are on strike as a result of the operation of the plants by non-union men and the proposed reduction in wages.
