EACH season in its own order has largely contributed to the sick list and death roll of the province, especially in the eastern section whose record of sickness and of deaths far outnumber that of previous years. Pneumonia and that insidious disease, measles, now so prevalent have despoiled many a home in spite of all that medical skill and kindly ministrations of friends and neighbors could do in alleviating pain and staying the hand of death. At Victoria Cross, Lot 51, recently four deaths have occurred from the maladies described and in the family of David Reid is now prostrated with grief because the angel of death has laid its withering hand upon three of its members. This thrice repeated affliction has cost a deep gloom over the entire community and wide-spread sympathy is evinced by all. On the 14th of March the infant son of Mr. Reid died, aged 7 months and 11 days. Little Willard Klischen contracted measles and in spite of every effort he passed away in the arms of Him who said, "Suffer little children to come unto me and forbid them not, for of such is the Kingdom of Heaven." On the 10th of the same month, Christiana M. A., wife of Mr. Reid, departed this life at the early age of 42 years, after lingering but a few days in intense suffering from the effects of measles. Several years ago deceased identified herself with the Church of God, and amidst the cares and toils of life she remained a devoted and consistent member of St. Andrew's Presbyterian church at Montague, and will there be missed for the tender graces that adorned her character. She seemed to have a premonition of her death from the first of her sickness, making distribution of her effects among the dear ones whom she was so soon to leave behind. She talked to her husband of her approaching death with that calmness which only characterizes the Christian, assuring him she was not afraid to die. Her death was a victory of faith, and now rests from the toils and cares of this transient life. She was buried in the beautiful cemetery at Union Road, and there laid to rest till the resurrection morn. Death was not apprehended by the sacrifice of two precious lives upon its altar, for on the third day of April, Mr. Reid's eldest daughter, Sadie Divina, in her 20th year, after a few days of severe illness, passes away from earth to her home in the skies, there to meet the mother and brother who have gone before. Of her it may be said that she was a good girl, humble, and peaceful in her manner, endowed with those graces that adorn the youthful life. Admitted much sorrow and sympathy for the family her remains were laid to rest beside the lifeless form of the loved one already laid aside from earth's troubles and sorrows. As now we let the curtain fall upon the thrice sad scenes of Mr. Reid's home we would say, "Through your tears look with hope to the skies of God's glorious promises and say trustfully, 'It is we I God's will be done.'"—Com.

THE late James Marquis, whose death is reported in to-day's Guardian, was the second son of Alexander Marquis, who came to the Island over one hundred years ago, and married Nellie McNeill, a daughter of John McNeill, the original McNeill settler in Cavendish. They made their home in Millvale, where James, the second son was born, May 1st, 1812. About fifty-nine years ago he moved to Detroit, Michigan, where he resided till his death, which occurred on April 6th in his 94th year. His wife, who predeceased him a number of years, was Ellen, daughter of the late Thomas Clark, of Darnley. There were born to them three children, two of whom are still alive—Thomas a civil engineer of Chicago, and Euphemia who has always lived with her father in Detroit and has tenderly cared for him in his declining years. He was the last survivor of a family of four brothers. He worked at his trade of ship carpenter for over fifty years, and was one of the substantial citizens of Detroit. He was an intelligent, genial man, of blameless life and had many fast friends on the Island whom he visited frequently. Mrs. Thomas Clark now living in Cascumpee, and the late Mrs. Even Crosby of Bonshaw, were half sisters, and Captain Alexander Fairbairn of New York, and Thomas T. Fairbairn of Lawrence, Mass., are half brothers of the deceased.
