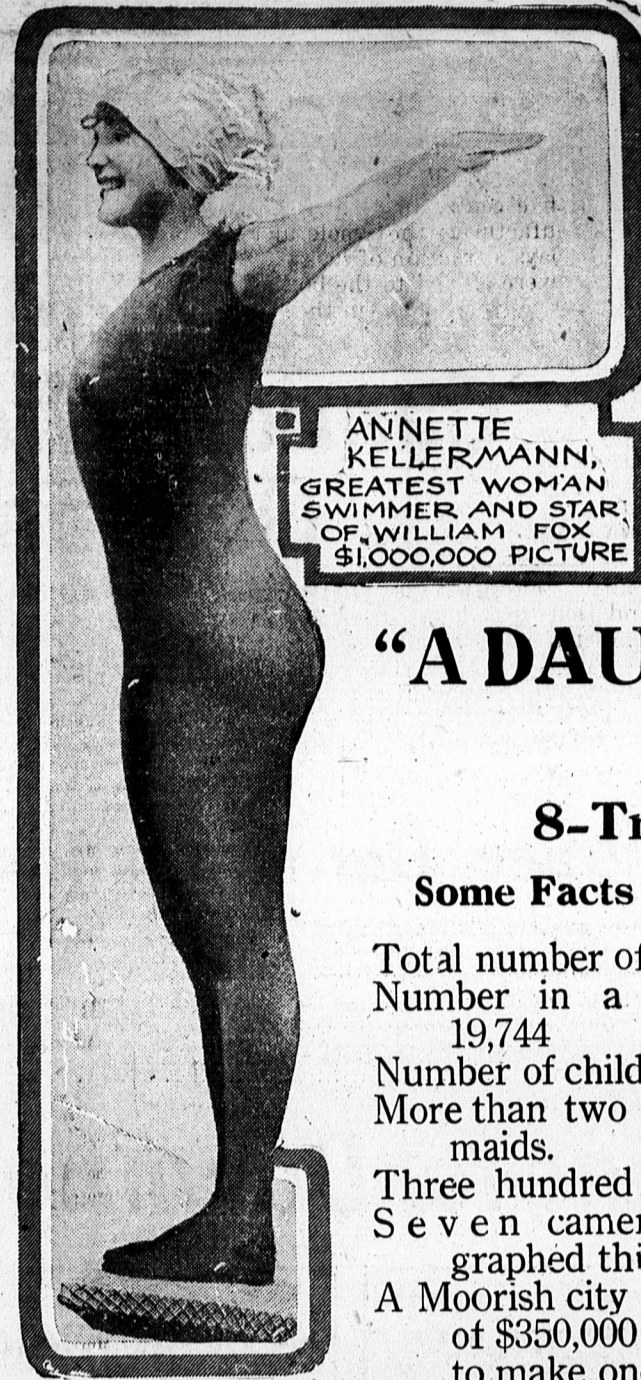

**A TRIBUTE.**—Rev. F. N. Atkinson, of Hazelbrook, leaves the Province to become Pastor of the Baptist Church at Goldboro and Isaac's Harbour, N. S. In the removal of Mr. Atkinson the religious work of the Province has lost one of its most helpful workers. Mr. and Mrs. Atkinson were both greatly beloved by the Hazelbrook people and gave themselves unsparingly to the work. All departments of the church work have prospered under the leadership of Mr. Atkinson and he leaves with the deep regret of all. Mrs. Atkinson also filled a large place in the hearts of the people. Before leaving the Red Cross presented her with an appreciative address thanking her for the brave stand she had taken regarding methods of raising funds to carry on the work of the society and for the good influence of her talks regarding the noble purposes and high ideals for which the Society was working. The address was accompanied by a purse of money which after supplementing Mrs. Atkinson handed back as a gift to the Society with the request that it be used for their work. The Women's Missionary Society of the Hazelbrook Baptist Church also presented Mrs. Atkinson with an address and a purse of \$20.00 as a token of appreciation of her work in the church. At Alexander a like appreciative address and purse was presented. The Christian Church at the Cross Roads which also formed a part of Mr. Atkinson's charge bid them a tender and affectionate farewell and presented Mrs. Atkinson with \$35.00. At the service at Hazelbrook Sunday evening Sept. 15th Mr. Atkinson gave his final message and Mrs. Atkinson sang a parting solo. The church was crowded with appreciative friends and many were the expressions of regret at their leaving. Mr. Atkinson has labored for two years on this field and now finds the demands of the work too taxing for his strength and the Nova Scotian call offered a more compact field which it seemed advisable for him to accept.
