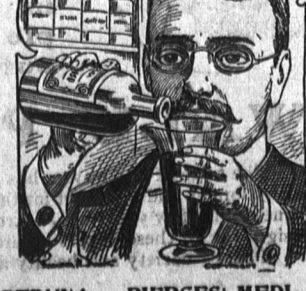

BIRD PROTECTION

A recent issue of the Montreal Star has the following article which will be of interest to many.—An unusual circumstance has occurred this winter. During the early part of the season a flock of fifty or more gulls appeared along the Chemung River, which runs through the centre of the city of Elmira, N. Y. For a distance of three-quarters of a mile on the south side of Water street the river bank is lined with business houses. The river being frozen solid, the merchants threw out plenty of feed for the birds, who thus remained contented. At the end of February this flock was increased to 200 or more. It has been an interesting sight for the citizens to witness the flight of these birds. There are a number of islands and shallow spots in the river as it flows through the city, and after the flood of a month ago had subsided these spots were allie with the birds, which would sit huddled in rows, extending half way across the river, presenting a curious spectacle to people who are unacquainted with their habits. It is said that gulls were never known to visit this section before, but these are believed to have been driven inland from the Great Lakes because they were closed by ice. Whether they will remain here this summer or return to their haunts along the upper lakes is a matter of conjecture. Luckily for them, there is a heavy fine in store for any one molesting these birds in any way, so they have lived in peace.
