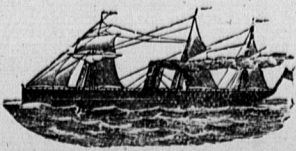

A RUSH FOR LAND.

EDSON, Alta., Sept. 12—What gives indication of being one of the most historic land rushes in the annals of Canadian colonization is scheduled to start from here early in January, when the new fifteen-foot wagon road to Sturgeon Lake, the gateway of the Grand Prairie and the Peace River country, will be open for traffic. Already forty families, comprising over a hundred men, women and children, the vanguard of a host that is hourly increasing and will probably reach several thousand souls before the great trek begins, are camped on the outskirts of Edson awaiting the word to start.

A heterogeneous mass of household and farming utensils, as varied in their make and marks as in the nationality of their owners, strewn the roadside. Dakotans and Minnesotans, giving the lie to recent reports that Americans are returning to their old farms in the States; Manitobans and Albertans, hardly able to restrain themselves until the few remaining months go by; Russians and Germans have pitched their tents by the side of the road for the last rest before the start for the land of promise is made.

Women and children form no small part of the advancing army of colonists. Eight infants in arms are among the number. Horses, oxen and dogs are being taken along, and most of the settlers will be ready for work within a fortnight after they have selected their homesteads and made proper entry of them.

LEARNING TO CHEW GUM.

NEW YORK, Sept. 13—The Sun has received the following from London: The Germans are to be educated in the gum-chewing habit. "Kaugummi" they call it, and in advertisements it is described as "excellent for sportsmen, refreshing and disinfecting, an aid to digestion and the best means to get rid of the habit of excessive smoking."

The Munich Medizinische Wochenschrift, an influential medical weekly does not look upon the prospect at all and warns Germany against the danger of becoming a country of ever moving jaws. It describes the alleged baneful effects of gum-chewing, of which spitting is the least harmful, it declares.

WANTS HIS LIBERTY.

NEW YORK, Sept. 13—Newly-engaged counsel for Harry K. Thaw are quoted in the New York Herald today as predicting that Thaw will shortly renew his battle to gain freedom from the State Hospital for the Insane at Matteawan, where he has been confined for killing Stanford White.

"Thaw is sane. It will be a matter of only a few months until he is free," Harry J. Rice, an associate of Clarence J. Shearn, the well known lawyer, is quoted as asserting. "Thaw can never again be tried by jury, and there will be proof enough to show that he is not a maniac."

YOUNG WIFE'S COMPLAINT.

WINDSOR, Sept. 13—A suit for damages has been instituted against the estate of the late John Buhler, a well known farmer of North Colchester, by pretty Mrs. Anna Martha Buhler, the young wife of Frank Buhler. Slander and alienation of her husband's affection are alleged against the father-in-law, now deceased.

Young Mrs. Buhler declares that because she was disliked by her husband's family they induced Frank Buhler to desert her and return to his home, and that she was left without means of support. The case will be heard at the fall assizes here.

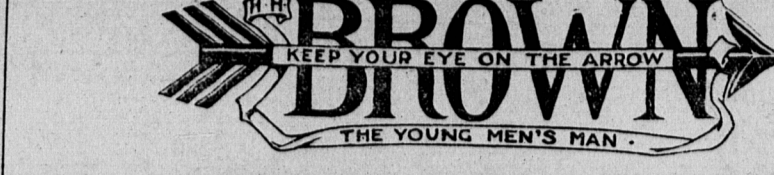

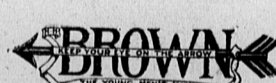
