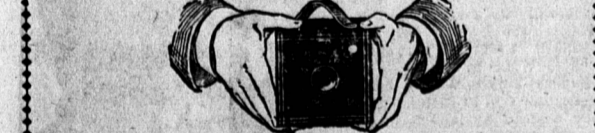

POST-GRADUATE COURSE IN MEDICINE.—Beginning September 1st a two weeks post-graduate course for qualified physicians will be given at Halifax under the auspices of the Faculty of Medicine of Dalhousie University. This course is free to all physicians, no matter from what college they may have graduated, and no matter where they may reside, as part of the public service which Dalhousie endeavours to render. The course was instituted in 1922 and repeated last year, but on both occasions lasted for only a week. The interest it has created, however, and the numbers of physicians who have attended, have encouraged the faculty to double the length of the course, and also to invite prominent doctors from other colleges to take part in the teaching. This year Sir Henry Gray and Doctors Chipman and Rhea of Montreal, Dr. Rudolf of Toronto, Doctors Luther MacKenzie and Rose Faulkner, of New York, and Dr. A. F. Miller of Kentville, will give lectures on clinics, besides members of the Dalhousie faculty. The Dalhousie medical school has developed wonderfully during the past few years, and now occupies a foremost position amongst the medical schools of this continent. This opportunity of taking a "refresher course" at a convenient time of the year and under peculiarly advantageous circumstances is greatly appreciated by the medical profession of the maritime provinces and Newfoundland, and promises this year to attract physicians from the interior of Canada and the United States.

of trade ships, fitted out elaborately and at great expense, being sent on tour throughout the world for the purpose of developing commerce. While the idea makes an undoubted appeal to the imagination and has had a good trial the failure of many of those schemes should make others pause before venturing on similar trade "stunts". While the Italian cruiser "Italia", which has been fitted up as a floating exhibition of Italian goods has had a remarkable success at Rio de Janeiro, other similar projects were on foot, but the first came to nothing. Two British companies were floated, but neither received sufficient support to enable it to carry out its ideas. Similarly, two French projects of Agriculture includes a statistical survey of the available supplies and requirements of wheat throughout the world. The objective proposed is to ascertain, on the one hand, the quantities that were exportable from the producing countries on March 1st, 1924, and, on the other, to define the quantity which the importing countries have yet to secure in order to provide for their own requirements until their next wheat harvests become available. At the beginning of March the exporting countries had on hand an aggregate quantity of exportable wheat amounting to about 308 million centals (a cental is 100 lbs.) while the probable requirements to be imported between March 1st and July 31st into the importing countries as a whole are likely to exceed 143 million centals. The available supply, consequently, shows a large surplus; and it may be expected that, on August 1st next, a date when the new harvest of the northern hemisphere should be realised, there will still remain nearly 165 million centals of wheat stocks of the old crop on hand in the exporting countries. The corresponding stock on August 1st, 1923, was about 71 million centals. The Institute states that in nearly all the north European countries winter crops are backward owing to the long period of cold weather; frost damage is reported, particularly in Belgium and Poland, and floods have also done some injury.
