### THE POSSIBILITIES OF MARITIME CANADA.

In these days of coronation, imperial conference, census taking and immigration we naturally pause to take stock of the possibilities of our future. To what status may these Maritime Provinces yet attain in the centuries to come? In area they are but a fraction of the extent of Canada, or even of one of the larger Provinces to the westward. Yet the square miles of the Maritime Provinces are almost precisely the same as those of England. Think of England, the mother of nations, and what she has achieved in history, England with thirty-five millions of people today, all inhabiting a country no larger than the Maritime Provinces.

Scotland is just a fraction larger than the sister Province of New Brunswick, and Ireland just a little larger than New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island together. But Scotland has four and a half millions of people, and Ireland, though now depopulated by an exodus that has been going on for sixty years, had at the beginning of that period eight millions of people. Greece, with two millions and a half of people, a land of great achievements and historic interest, is smaller than New Brunswick, and Switzerland with three and a half millions is little more than half as large as the sister Province.

In the new world we may find like comparisons for our comfort. Rhode Island, the smallest state in the American union, and with five times our population, has but less than two-thirds of the area of Prince Edward Island. Most of the lands of which we have spoken are old and their development has been the work of hundreds and even of thousands of years. All America is yet a new world as compared with Europe. White men only began to settle in America four hundred years ago. And down to recent years Canada was quite overshadowed by the United States.

Our population in the Maritime Provinces has been in the past drawn away, southward to the States and

westward to Ontario, the prairies and British Columbia, but this is only a temporary adjustment, a process of levelling up of population throughout a vast area. Already the tide in the great human sea is turned northward from the United States to Canada. In due time there will come a reflex tide from the west toward the east, when the now rapidly filling west has become full. The flow of immigration into Canada will increase in volume from year to year, and Maritime Canada must yet get its share of this besides retaining its natural increase in much larger measure than heretofore.

Time will be required to complete the process, but in the centuries to come it is quite within the bounds of possibility that these three Canadian Provinces by the sea shall become as populous and as rich as England is today. With the marvellous development of cheap transport on facilities the peoples of the world are moving in millions as they never moved before. Europe with an area barely equal to that of Canada has now close upon 400,000,000 or an average of more than one hundred to the square mile. Any one of the Provinces of Canada affords and must for a century to come afford better opportunities for man than Europe can give.

Hence the redundant population of the old world must continue to flow into America, and with increasing volume into Canada. This is inevitable and it must be equally inevitable that in the great movements of population from the old world the splendid possibilities and abundant resources of the Maritime Provinces will attract increasing attention and increasing numbers. The day of the Busy East in Canada is surely coming and it will come with a rush in a few years from now in all human probability. For Canada is now recognized throughout the world as the land of great opportunities, and it is toward Canada that the kindreds and tribes of the earth are moving.

### THE HIGH COMMISSIONERSHIP.

It is announced that Lord Strathcona is about to resign the office of High Commissioner for Canada in Great Britain, and that time will be taken by the Government to secure a suitable successor for that important position. The duties are important and various. As defined by the Canadian statute they are:

1. "To act as representative and resident agent of Canada in the United Kingdom and in that capacity to execute such powers and perform such duties as are from time to time conferred upon and assigned to him by the Governor in Council."

2. "To take charge, supervision and control of the immigration offices and agencies in the United Kingdom, under the Minister of Agriculture."

3. "To carry out such instructions as he, from time to time receives from the Governor in Council respecting the commercial, financial and general interests of Canada in the United Kingdom and elsewhere."

The office was created in 1880, and was first held by the late Sir Alexander T. Galt in 1883. Sir Charles Tupper came next, holding the place from 1884 to 1887 and again from 1888 to 1896, when Lord Strathcona succeeded him and he is still in office.

It is not surprising that at ninety years of age Lord Strathcona should desire to be relieved from the somewhat arduous and at times delicate duties of the High Commissionership. He has administered the office during the past fifteen years with great ability, skill and success. The place is one for a first-class man.

who ought to combine executive force with diplomatic skill and also to hold high social standing. The traditions of the office have been high, so far.

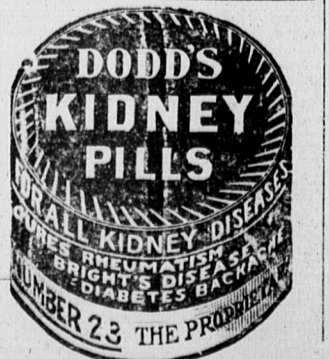
### CORONATION ETIQUETTE.

King George was recently crowned in great pomp and state, in the presence of crown princes and high dignitaries of many lands. But there were no kings, emperors or crowned heads in attendance. This is explained in the Standard of Empire on the basis of "coronation etiquette" which prescribes that the King and Queen shall be the chief figures at the ceremony. The underlying theory is that the presence of any other crowned head at a coronation would detract from the attention and interest that belong solely to the occupants of the coronation chairs.

That is why the German Emperor, the Emperor of Russia, Queen Alexandra and others, who have attained to imperial, kingly or queenly station, not a few of them related to King George and who would have liked to witness the ceremony had to content themselves with attending by deputy or not at all. One King and one Queen must share the honors of the crowning day, without the presence of any who could compare with them in the majesty of exalted station.

NOTES.

In Toronto and other cities where the census enumeration has been completed there are a good many complaints from persons who were not visited, and in which whole families were omitted from the list. ## CHINESE SHOOTING RUSSIAN FISHERMEN

ST. PETERSBURG, July 1.—Disquieting news is pouring in from the Chinese frontier. It is asserted that the Chinese persist in shooting at Russian fishermen who approach the Chinese bank. Amur and that they are also destroying the Russian navigation signs and life buoys on the Amur and Ussuria rivers.

The Russian consulates in Mongolia are reported as being besieged with complaints of hindrance to Russian trade, argued by new Chinese officials, who are acting upon special instruction from Peking.

Russian merchandise is closely inspected for contraband arms which it is alleged are being supplied to the Mongolians. It is represented that the passports and other restrictions have been introduced virtually with an aim of driving out the Russian traders.
