



—THE CANADIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY.—The Red Cross Society carries on the work initiated by Florence Nightingale. It is international in character and knows no distinctions of race or religion. Its main object and purpose is to aid the sick and wounded, and it is the only means by which aid can be effectively and safely forwarded to the fields of battle. Its flag is immune from attack by general agreement of all civilized nations. It provides armored field hospitals, equipped with doctors, nurses and supplies, enabling it to aid and succor the wounded on the field. All who stay in safety at home should realize the imperative duty resting upon them of helping those who are risking their lives at the front. The society is organizing committees in each town and village of the Island, is opening a depot in Charlottetown for the receipt of all contributions in kind which may be sent to it, where they will be carefully assorted and forwarded to the front. The Treasurer will receive and acknowledge in the press all money contributions. The officers, in addition to a large committee, are: Sir Louis Davies, Vice-President for Prince Edward Island of the Central Council; Mr. Justice Hazard, President; Mr. Frank Hearsh, Vice-President; Dr. Stephen Jenkins, Secretary; Mr. Percy Pope, Treasurer.
