The death occurred about 1.30 p. m. yesterday of Capt. George Clark, Summerside, after an illness of three weeks of congestion of the lungs. Deceased was born at Tryon on Dec. 13, 1833, and was thus in his 72nd year. The late Capt. Clark in his earlier life lived on the farm of his father, but when quite a young man entered into seafaring and has since followed this occupation, chiefly in coasting vessels. For a number of years he was pilot on the Str. St. Lawrence plying between Charlottetown and Picton and later on the Str. Northumberland on the Summerside, Point du Chene route. He was also pilot on the winter steamer Stanley between Summerside and Cape Tormentine during the testing of the route. Among shippers and the travelling public Capt. Clark was widely and most favorably known and had a reputation of a skillful and careful coaster. He leaves a widow, three daughters - Mrs. (Capt) Charles Stright, Victoria; Mrs. Thomas Keddy and Mrs. John Beattie, Summerside, Mass., and one son Edgar of Clark & Buchanan, Summerside. Surviving him also are three sisters, Mrs. Pearson residing in New Brunswick, Mrs. J. W. Clark, Linkletter and Mrs. Ephraim Clark, Lot 15 and one brother Charles W. Clark, Tryon.

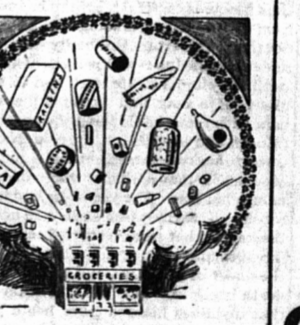
