SYDNEY, May 27—The schooner J. and L. Irving, which left on Saturday for Buctouche with coal, was carried ashore near the entrance of Big Bras D'Or on same evening. She remained aground during Sunday and Monday and when the big gale sprang up on Monday she was carried along by a mile and finally laid hard and fast near the lighthouse. The crew managed with difficulty, to make their escape. The vessel's bottom was torn out and she now lies a total wreck with the greater part of her cargo washed away.

P. E. I. HOSPITAL ANNUAL MEETING

(Continued from page 1.)
The amount received from paying patients during the year was \$6149.62, being an increase of \$1268.69 over the previous year, while the income from other sources varied very little from that of the preceding year.

A legacy of \$25, was left by Mrs. Joseph Copp of Milton was the only addition to the Endowment Fund during the year.

The increased receipts are particularly welcome as this year the trustees will be called upon to incur large extraordinary expenditure, more rooms will be required for patients, and a new system of heating must be installed. When the time came for the installation of the heating apparatus in the new hospital it was considered imperative by the medical staff of that day and the trustees that ventilation should accompany the heating. Accordingly after considerable investigation the MacEachern System, which appeared at the time to be satisfactory and comparatively inexpensive, was chosen and placed in the building. Experience, however, has shown that its working is accompanied by several unpleasant effects, which, while tolerable perhaps to the well person, are not so to those suffering from sickness and nervous complaints. It has become year by year more unsatisfactory, and the trustees have reached the conclusion that it must be replaced by a better one. After careful enquiry they have decided in favour of "a low-pressure steam vacuum system." Plans and specifications have been prepared under their direction and they are now awaiting the settlement of some minor matters prior to awarding the contract.

The trustees desire to specially mention the handsome donations of an iron chair from Miss Lauges of Rochester, New York, an Oak Cabinet from G. D. Wright and a Dressing Carriage for Ward from R. M. Johnson.

The trustees also desire to thank the Ladies' Aid Society, the Medical Staff, and the many other benefactors of the Institution.

A GREAT BOOM FOR CHARLOTTETOWN

It is understood that the Dominion Government has definitely decided to establish an experimental farm in this city.

Information on the subject is exceedingly difficult to obtain. However it is safe to state that about sixty-five acres on the west end of Mount Edward Road will be purchased for the purpose.
