Don't Be Too Harsh On Your Adolescent Son. Humor and Praise Will do More Than Criticism in Guiding Him Along the Right Path



A bewildered mother, who realizes that she knows as little about how to manage her adolescent son as she does about lion taming, asks me if I can give her a few suggestions about how to handle this strange and unpredictable creature into which her adorable small boy has suddenly turned.

Hence, about all the advice you can give the mother of an adolescent son is to bid her pray for patience and cultivate her funny bone, for this affliction will pass.

Now no one will contend that an adolescent boy is easy to get along with. On the contrary, he is about as pleasant a companion as a fretful porcupine.

INSIDE NEEDS ATTENTION
Now that the fur has received its spring tonic, look into the inside of your coat.

Pay attention to the lining, for a torn lining or a coat without a top by which to hang it look untidy.

Broken loops should be carefully removed and new ones inserted. The best way to do this is to undo the lining and stitch the new loop firmly on the inside.

Furs that have been out in the rain should never be dried artificially, but hung on a coat hanger

away from strong heat. When dry, you will find they regain their normal appearance after a light brushing.

Smooth short-haired fur, like seal or mole will regain its gloss if smoothed with a piece of linen damask or a soft silk handkerchief.

A sprinkle of eau-de-Cologne on the cloth is a capital cleanser and beautifier of fur.

The life of fur and fur-trimmed coats may be prolonged considerably by careful treatment. To slip your coat in a hanger is the work of a second, but the little care thus expended means, maybe, an added year of life.

THE COOK'S CORNER

CORONATION CAKE

If you plan a party around the date of the Coronation why not try this specially created recipe for Coronation Cake? It will make an excellent wedding cake, too, and will keep well. Of course, the little king and his royal consort who stand so imperially atop the coronation cake are dolls dressed by the clever home dressmaker.

THE RECIPE

Five cups sifted cake flour, 3 teaspoons combination baking powder, 1-4 teaspoon soda, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 3 teaspoons cinnamon, 1 teaspoon allspice, 1 teaspoon mace, 1-2 teaspoon nutmeg, 3 pounds raisins, finely cut, 2 pounds currants, 1-2 pound dates seeded and finely cut, 1 pound citron, thinly sliced, 1 tablespoon grated orange rind, 1-2 teaspoon grated lemon rind, 1 pound butter or other shortening, 1 pound brown sugar, 12 eggs, well beaten, 4 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted, 1 cup molasses, 1 cup tart jelly, 3-4 cup orange juice, 3 tablespoons lemon juice.

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder, soda, salt and spices, and sift together three times. Sift 1 cup of flour mixture over fruit and mix well. Combine orange and lemon rind with butter, creaming thoroughly; add sugar gradually and cream together until light and fluffy. Add eggs and chocolate and blend; then molasses, jelly, and fruit juices. Add flour gradually, beating well after each addition; then add fruit. Divide into pans which have been greased, lined with heavy paper, and again greased. Bake in slow oven (250 degrees F.) until done. In 10-inch pan (6 1-2 pounds batter), bake 5 1-2 hours; in 7 1-2-inch pan (4 pounds batter) bake 4 hours; in 5-inch pan (2 pounds batter) bake 3 hours.

ORNAMENTAL FROSTING

Four tablespoons butter, 5 cups sifted confectioners' sugar, 2 egg whites unbeaten, 2 tablespoons cream (about), 1-2 teaspoons vanilla, 1-4 teaspoon salt. Cream butter; add part of the sugar gradually blending after each addition. Add remaining sugar alternately with egg whites, then with cream, until of right consistency to spread. Beat a few each addition until smooth. Add vanilla and salt. Double this recipe to frost and decorate Coronation Cake.

WHAT IS HOME WITHOUT A GARDEN? ROOT CROPS ARE MAINSTAY OF VEGETABLE GARDEN

Grubbing roots for food has been an occupation of mankind since the dawn of civilization and although modern man has invented machines to take the place of the primitive fork or finger, making the task of growing comparatively simple, there has been little essential change in method of culture, and even less in popularity. The roots still remain staple food products, spring, all through the season, even winter permitting a few of them to survive.

The soil should be dug deep, with a liberal allowance of plant food added. Not so long ago, one of the many food crops sprang up which advocated the abandonment of all root crops as food for human consumption, but like all fads of its kind, it proved nothing but a transitory delusion, and was soon forgotten.
