**FEED THE COW RIGHT**

During the winter, when cows are stall fed, be careful to use foods that will not have a deleterious effect upon the milk, especially when it is required for buttermaking. Where the cow's rations are judiciously blended there will be no ill effect upon the butter, so long as the milk is not allowed to absorb odours given off from the foods.

A great deal of food tainted milk especially the turnip taint, is due to the warm milk in the orders given off from the food when the cows are fed at or just before milking time. If the food agrees with the cow, the milk will not be food tainted if the cows are fed after milking and the milk is removed as soon as it is obtained from the cow.

When the cow's rations contain a fair percentage of carrots, butter of good color is produced in the winter. Carrots are of good feeding value, but not used very extensively, on account of other foods given to cows has some effect upon the texture of the butter.

to harmonize with the hair, and nothing presents a stranger contrast than the mellowed lines of the face and the impossible brown, black or gold of the hair framing in, when the color is artificially produced. Also, once the hair is dyed, it must be kept died, or an unattractive streaked coiffure is the result.

The woman whose hair is white has several important rules of conduct" to remember. In the first place her brushes and combs must be scrupulously clean, for specks of dust will dull the silvery gloss of her hair. She must avoid the shampoo and tonics that other women buy, for many of these would leave ugly yellow streaks behind them. She should never let water from a tap run directly on to her hair. The only water she should use for washing purposes is rain water, carefully strained through a cloth, or filtered water. No colored soap should be used, or any soap that may leave the hair streaked, or, worse still, dry out the beautiful natural sheen. All applications must be white for white hair. A transparent white soap or pure white castile will be found satisfactory. Shave the soap, then pour over it boiling water, about three quarts of soap. Keep it in a warm place until the soap is dissolved, set aside until cool, then add a large spoonful of lime water and bottle for future use.

AT the time of shampooing the hair, about half a pint of this solution is added to the beaten whites of two eggs, and both are beaten well together. After the scalp and hair are wet, this is massaged into the scalp. Perfect rinsing of white hair is always necessary. A little indigo, such as can be bought at drug stores, not the ordinary washing water. Extreme artificial heat must never be used, and the hair should be dried by hand carefully, as white hair is more brittle than any other.
